FROM THE SHARED PASTOR'S DESK:

- 1. Public Service Announcement WRAP (Wisconsin Rent Assistance Program) provides for rent assistance due to COVID-19 related concerns or issues; call 1-262-268-2723 for further information and to see if your need qualifies.
- 2. Please Remember to Vote In the upcoming Primary Election to be held Tuesday, August 11, 2020. I recommend that those, like me, in a Covid-19 higher risk category due to age or conditions, vote absentee as I've already done!
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist Are receiving additional special training in safety practices and, for the foreseeable future, those so trained will be the only additional authorized distributors of Holy Communion helping our priests and deacon. Training was supplied by Cindy Rogers RN who is particularly specialized in these matters, serving as a surgical room nurse at VA Hospital, Wood, WI. In order to keep worshippers assuredly safe during the distribution of Holy Communion, these ministers will a.) Approach the altar with mask covering nose and mouth; b.) Use hand sanitizer upon arrival in the sanctuary; c.) Pull their mask down to receive Holy Communion; d.) Adjust the mask back into place, again using hand sanitizer, keeping their hands away from their faces thereafter; e.) After they receive a ciborium of consecrated hosts, they will distribute Holy Communion. Please be sure to receive the Holy Eucharist in such a way that you and they do not touch one another (If this occurs, the extraordinary minister MUST stop distribution and sanitize their hands before continuing); f.) After completing distribution they will again sanitize their hands before returning to their places. This training was first offered at St. Peter's due to a considerably larger occupancy in accord with Archdiocesan matrix; our priests and deacon will continue to be the ordinary distributors at Resurrection & St. Lawrence for the time being; extraordinary ministers at these parishes will receive special training when the matrix may be adjusted to accommodate increased percentages for church facility occupancy.
- 4. 2020 Catholic Stewardship Appeal Reports that we have now exceeded our goal of \$20,400 at a level of 104.24% resulting in gifts totaling \$21,265.10 from 124 donors or 20.60% of our parish membership; an extraordinarily generous response in unprecedented times, the earliest fulfillment of our goal I can remember in many years; many thanks to everyone for such a splendid participation and response to this worthy cause. Overall, the Campaign has received to date a total of \$5,789,987.37 from 24,815 donors toward goal of \$8.1 million; additional participation encouraged!
- 5. Re-Opening School/Religious Education Programs A special committee has begun to meet to help us prepare for what we hope to be a return to some normalcy this fall with regard to pre-school/elementary education/formation (St. Peter School) and religious formation programs K-12 for public education students this fall. While heavy on the representation from St. Peter Catholic School, our Directors of Religious Education and Youth Ministers from all our three parishes are participants, too, as each program is housed in whole/part in a school facility wherein the health, safety, happiness, holiness and well-being of children/youth, staff/volunteers are of utmost concern; as discussions are at a very preliminary level, there is nothing specific yet to report except that we hope soon to have sound plans in place for these very important ministries. Stay tuned ...
- **6. St. Bridget of Sweden** Some saints are less well known than others and she, to us, is one of them. When she was a child, she had two visions, one of Christ and the other of Our Lady; both affected her spiritual life deeply. Married for 28 years, she had 8 children (one also became a saint that's the goal of Christian parenting, to raise saints), gained a reputation for her care of the sick (usually performing the humblest tasks herself, bringing her children along to help maybe that's part of making saints), and continued to have visions that made her wonder if she was delusional. Her husband died and although left a widow, she

founded of the Order of the Most Holy Savior, now commonly called the Bridgettines, devoted to simplicity in life and service to the poor. Her visions continued and, at times, they involved her in the politics of the day: she urged the Pope to return to Rome from Avignon (in a vision she was told he was a "destroyer of souls, worse than Lucifer, more unjust than Pilate, more merciless than Judas"); of course, her letters to him, due to strong wording, were not read! She opposed Crusades that were but a thin disguise for monarchs to gain land, not souls, by conversion; she was not into popularity contests nor did she respect vested interests! People took her visionary concerns and applied them for their own advantage, claiming that she supported their causes. Warning that great disasters loomed if people failed to reform their lives at times left her penniless and unpopular, but her life of service to the poor and the sick never left her far from the admiration of her contemporaries. We all know people whose points of view may get under our skins a bit, but God finds great good to do for us through them! Could it be that her life is a way of appreciating those who speak of controversial political or social issues in spiritual terms ...


CAPITAL CAMPAIGN—GOAL \$250.000
