FROM THE SHARED PASTOR'S DESK:

1. St. Mary Goretti – Is honored on Tuesday, July 06; the daughter of a poor tenant farmer, she had no chance to go to school, never learned to read or write, and made a late First Communion as she had problems learning her catechism; she was beautiful, and precociously physically mature for a 12 year-old. A neighbor boy, an 18 year-old by the name of Alessandro Serenelli, noticed and attempted to force his attentions on her. She struggled, called for help; as she knew that decency and respect for one's body were part and parcel of faith, she said "No, God does not wish it; it is a sin. You would go to hell for it." This enraged Alessandro and he stabbed her to death with a stiletto. She was taken to a hospital where she died about 24 hours later, but not before forgiving her murderer, worrying where her mother would sleep that night (the house was a crime scene), and making her last Holy Communion. Alessandro was given a 30-year prison sentence which he thought excessively unfair; for a long time he was unrepentant. One night he had a vision of Maria gathering flowers and offering them to him; his life changed and, when he was released three years early, his first act was to visit Maria's mother to ask her forgiveness. Maria's absolute trust and simple faith in God, along with numerous miracles determined to be through her intercession, led to her beatification in 1947 (present were her 82 year-old mother, two sisters and a brother) and canonization in 1950; Alessandro Serenelli, 66 years old, was present; he knelt and wept for joy! A statue of Maria Goretti was placed in St. Peter's then new school building when it first opened; she is still there!

2. Catholicism and Patriotism – Are most certainly compatible but not completely identical; as citizens we should take an active part in public life by participating in areas for which one has personal responsibility – care for and education of one's family, conscientious work, and other voluntary, generous involvement in activities that promote the dignity of every person and help achieve the common good. We are to be loyal collaborators with what is right and good for all, but, at times, have the duty and the right to voice concern about that which seems harmful. Citizens are called to love and serve one's country in gratitude for freedom and as an expression of charity. This means that we have the duty to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend our country. Included with these duties, to the extent we're able, we are to welcome foreigners in search of the security and the means of a livelihood that is unavailable or denied in their country of origin. While we are taught to "render unto Caesar what is Caesar's," we are also taught "we must obey God rather than men." When civil authorities direct or encourage what is contrary to the moral order, the fundamental rights of persons, or teachings of the Gospel and our Church, we are bound by upright consciences not to cooperate, to respectfully dissent and, within reason, resist. When I was a child in the elementary grades at Mother of Perpetual Help Parish School, staffed by Franciscan Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother, we said the pledge of allegiance to the flag at the start of every school day, BUT that pledge came second to the one the good sisters rightly insisted was far more important; I still remember reciting, with folded hands pointed toward the Crucifix: "I pledge allegiance to the Cross of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and to His Church for which it stands; one, holy, catholic and apostolic, with grace and salvation for all. Amen." One nation we are and shall be if we remember that we are truly, always under God, not above ...

3. 2021 Catholic Stewardship Appeal – Reports further progress toward our goal of **\$20,400** with gifts/pledges totaling **\$20,588** to date or **100.92%** of goal achieved from **116** donors, **19.43%** of our membership; thank you! An additional mailing was recently made by the Archdiocese to those still contemplating participation (those who've already given are not included in this mailing) and telemarketing calls will be made on behalf of the Archdiocese to lapsed Catholic Stewardship Appeal donors beginning July 12 through August by the firm of Ruffalo, Noel, and Levitz. Again, thanks!

4. Critical Race Theory – Is a relatively recently coined term for analysis of race relations past, present, & future as they receive more intense attention in today's public sphere. Catholic Schools and parish-based formation programs do **not** teach this "theory" but do teach what is pertinent as contained in our Catholic Catechism – "Racism is an unjust discrimination on the basis of a person's race, a violation of human dignity and a sin against justice (CC#1935)." This teaching is based in Scripture wherein it is taught: "Show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. However, if you fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself,' you are doing well. But if you show partiality, you commit sin, and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law, but falls short in one particular, has become guilty in respect to all of it." (Jas 2:1, 8-10)

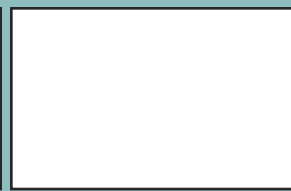
