Notify the parish office if your family member is in need of the Sacrament or call Fr. Nusi directly.


<u>Baptism</u>

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Liturgy of this Sunday deals with the overflowing mercy and kindness of a loving, forgiving and healing God for His creatures. The healing experience impacts the person so much that he or she cannot leave the presence of God that liberated him or her, for the ultimate salvation is being in that presence always.

Today's Gospel reports that the faith is not a leap in dark; it is a leap out of darkness into the light which is made real by this miracle in the life of Barthimaeus. His faith led him at last to jump out of darkness into the marvelous light of the presence of Jesus. The first reading reports about the faith of the exiled people of Israel as a similar experience of leaping and jumping out of joy at the prospect of the return to their home, to a time of Lord's leading them to the brooks of water, a symbol of new life. The second reading, while dwelling in the graceful life of the high priest, highlights the way he is representative of the common man, that he is able to sympathize with the erring and ignorant. This is possible because he himself is beset by weakness and sinfulness. The message is that faith helps us to understand better our brothers and sisters when they go wrong and annoy us in different ways, when we ourselves are conscious of our unworthiness and weakness. Faith makes us transcend our human weaknesses and hold on to the power of God who can save and transform us. Let us learn to remain strong in our faith, even amidst hardships.
