

John said: One mightier than I is coming; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.







Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, or His "manifestation" as the Light, not only for Israel, but for all nations and peoples. The Magi in today's Gospel stand for the Gentile world completing the larger picture that portrays God's intention to save Israel and beyond. The three wise men in the story represent all of us. Their journey through field and fountain, moor and mountain, following yonder star reflects our own search for purpose and meaning in life.



At the heart of it all is the innocence of the new-born Child who draws us into His presence from our darkness into His wonderful light. The Epiphany story has a timeless message and will always be relevant because God promises that anyone who really searches will find Him. There is a reason why we long for something more and better than this world can provide. The searching of our restless hearts can find their rest only in Him. *Psalm 62 says*, "Only in God will my soul be at rest. In Him comes my salvation."

As Christmas draws to a close, the feast of the Epiphany reminds us that our life as believers in the Lordship of Jesus can only take on true meaning, if we walk that journey in the manner of the Magi following the path which we are to tread by living out the reason for Christmas. And the reason for Christmas is for us to walk the ways of the Lord by doing what He did in establishing God's Kingdom on earth, bringing the world from darkness into His Light. The poem which was made into song called "Now the Work of Christmas Begins" composed by Howard Thurman, an African-American theologian and civil rights leader, puts Christmas within the larger perspective of the Gospel which outlines the very mission of Jesus that we are to continue with a sense of urgency:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

The work of Christmas begins! Come and join the work in the field of the Lord for the harvest is plenty. May the spirit of Christmas live on in and out of Season.


