

Looking Ahead

I hope you all had a safe and enjoyable summer and that the kids are settled back into school!

I hope you all enjoyed your summer and were able to attend the great events here in the Village, such as the 4th of July Parade, National Night Out, and the summer Beer Garden series. Thank you to the Park and Recreation Committee for organizing the 4th of July Parade, and to Chief David Wentlandt, his family, and the National Night Out Committee for another great event.

The 2021 road project is nearing completion and planning for the 2022 project has already begun with sanitary and storm sewer televising and cleaning, pavement core drillings, and surveying. The 2022 project will tentatively include new water main and road surface on Eggert Pl and Detrie Ct (North of 127th St), 125th and 126th Street between Fairmount Ave and Eggert Pl, Lancaster Ave between 124th and 125th, and Colfax Pl between 124th and 125th. The project will be bid in March with a May anticipated start date.

Loose leaf collection will begin at the end of October and run through the end of November, weather permitting. There is no set schedule, just place your loose leaves at the curb line and we will collect them. We hope to make one pass of the Village each week. Please do not bag your leaves, they will not be collected.

Finally, the Village Board will be reviewing the 2022 Proposed Budget on October 26 at 5 pm and will adopt the Budget on November 16. Property Tax bills are expected to be mailed in early December. Check the Village website for meeting dates/times.

Greeting from the Butler Police Department

The summer of 2021 went quickly (as most summers do), but we continue to persevere and started to get back to normal. During the last half of the summer, the Village had three very successful events, including National Night Out, St. Agnes Festival, and Hot Rods on Hampton. All three of these celebrations were well attended and showcased how great Butler is.

One of the most frequent questions we receive is about over night parking. As the colder months draw near and the winter parking restrictions begin (Nov. 15), I wanted to take this opportunity once again to remind everyone of our night parking ordinances. Parking stickers can be purchased at Village Hall M-F 8:00a – 4:00p and cost \$33.00/quarter or \$130.00/year. These stickers must be placed in the front left (driver's) window in the lower corner.

Here are a few additional reminders for our overnight parking ordinance:

- There is no parking on any Village street between 3:00am and 6:00am, however...
- Alternate side parking is permitted on Village streets with the issuance of a parking permit issued for each quarter.
- Free Days – All Friday nights, Saturday nights, and Holiday nights do not require a permit or alternate side parking March 15 – November 15. During the winter months (Nov 15 – Mar 15), alternate side parking is required every day of the week, however permits continue only to be required Sunday night through Thursday Night.

- No permit? You can call the overnight Parking Hotline (262-781-2431 x7). Leave your name, phone number, license plate, vehicle description, and address where it will be parked. We normally will allow a vehicle to be "called in" **2-3 times per month** before we will ask that a permit be purchased.
- Snow emergencies - When a snow emergency is declared, there is no street parking, even if you have a permit and are parked on the correct side of the street. All vehicles must be moved off the road! DPW will clear out the parking lots at Upper Frontier Park and both municipal lots for off street parking during a snow emergency.

Lastly, we continue to take numerous theft calls and when these involve a car, the vast majority of the time the owner forgot to lock their car. PLEASE, always lock your house and car doors because criminals look for the easy targets. In addition, if criminals are not successful when they come to "work" in Butler, they will choose a different location. Lastly, if you see something suspicious, no matter how minor it might be, call us at 262-446-5070.

Did you know there is a Food Pantry in Butler? It is part of the St. Agnes Church and School at 12801 West Fairmount St, Northwest corner of the building. We have been serving the area for more than 25 years. When we are open, there is a Pantry sign on the door.

If you or someone you know is out of work, only working part time, low income, have major bills, we are here to help with your food. We are supported by donations from the parishioners, local businesses and the donation drums at Metro Market on 128th & Capitol and Piggly Wiggly at 124th & North. We also welcome donations of non-perishable food, cleaning products, hygiene products or cash donations. For a complete list of needed donations, visit our website at stagnesparish.org. They can be dropped off in the wood bin in St. Agnes lobby. Perishable food or frozen food can be dropped off when we are open on Mondays.



Loose Leaf Collection

Beginning in October, residents may rake their leaves into the street at the curb where the leaves will periodically be vacuumed by the Department of Public Works. There are no set times for the leaf collection, but they will be gathered within a week. This service runs through the end of November, weather dependent.

Reminders:

Do not bag the leaves. If the leaves are bagged they will not be vacuumed up.
Do not discard tree branches with the leaves.

BRINGING HAWAII TO YOU

Have you ever been to Hawaii and experienced the Pacific island culture? Well, if you'd like to see some of the traditions and customs of our 50th state, you don't have to travel thousands of miles to do so. Just visit Na Hale Cultural Arts Studios at 12519 W. Hampton Ave. where they "bring Hawaii to you." Malia Chow, the founder and program director of Na Hale, opened her studio in Butler in 2018 but has been performing professionally for 25 years. Malia's Honolulu born father was a talented musician and Malia grew up immersed in the music, dance and cultural mores of the Pacific islands. As a native Hawaiian, she prides herself on her commitment to authenticity and staying true to Hawaiian values.

Na Hale Studios houses two entities: Hale O Malo (Hah-lay O Mah-low) is a professional production company in its 25th year. This troupe of talented musicians and dancers has performed extensively throughout the state, country and world. Some noteworthy venues include the State Fair, most of the summer festivals, the Milwaukee Public Museum, UW-Milwaukee, the Holiday Folk Fair, Lambeau Field and too many places to mention. They travel throughout the country and abroad bringing ethnic Hawaiian customs and hospitality to life through music, dance, entertainment and education.

Na Hale (Nah-ha-lay), which means "many houses", is a non-profit cultural arts and community enrichment center. Its mission is to "inspire and enrich lives through dance, culture, music, wellness arts and community, in the spirit of aloha; and in honor of indigenous wisdom and its ability to nurture people and the planet."



In the Hawaiian language, "Aloha" is more than a word of greeting or farewell or a salutation. It envelops a spirit of mutual regard and affection and extends compassion and kindness to everyone – it's all encompassing and fully loving.

In response to numerous requests for classes over the years, Malia offers a multitude of cultural enrichment classes and workshops at the studio such as hula, ukulele, Pacific island martial arts, holistic wellness classes and more. This is a unique gathering place of culture, music and art for the community and there are some special events planned.

Mark your calendars for these very exciting open house nights hosted by Na Hale Studios. Offering beer, wine, live music and "aloha" to the public, enjoy an evening of music, dance, smiles, laughter and true Hawaiian hospitality to keep you warm during the fall and winter season.


