### *Family Together*

The implication to both the Pharisees and the crowd is that our concern should be focused more on our interior relationship with God than on exterior human rules.

This can sound great until we remember that our Catholic faith has many rules! There are rules about attending Mass and fasting. There are requirements to receive sacraments. We have a rich history of devotional prayers, each having its own, sometimes complicated, method. Are we sometimes like the Pharisees whom Jesus called hypocrites?

It helps to remember that the Church’s rituals, rules, and disciplines do have a purpose: to foster our relationship with God. The goal is to impact our hearts, so we love God and our faith more deeply and live that love more fully in our lives.

We can remind our children, who may resist rules, that all areas of life have rules.

Parents and sports have rules; older youth know jobs have rules. What is the purpose of those rules? How are the Church’s rules similar in purpose? What is the goal of the Church’s rules for their lives?

**PRAYER:** Dear Father, help us to embrace the good You have for us in the requirements of our faith. May our practice of that requirements change our hearts and lead us closer to you. Amen

Given their strict attention to hand washing, these Pharisees and scribes would probably feel right at home in our pandemic-conscious world! Of course, they were concerned about religious purity, not personal hygiene, but we can all relate to how meticulous they were.

Still, Jesus rightly called their purity practices what they were: “human tradition”. Nowhere in Scripture does God command His people to be so rigorous in cleansing themselves or their household items. Instead, what began as a precaution among priests gradually morphed into a litmus test for every Israelite. If you didn’t wash your hands just so, you were impure. It meant your faith was defective—or worse, *you* were defective.

Litmus tests can make things clear and simple, but the Pharisees were using them in the wrong way. To determine what was pure and impure, they needed to focus on what was lurking in their own hearts, not what was contaminating them from the outside. As Jesus warned them, it is “the things that come out from within—our own sinful inclinations—that defile us. (Mark7:15)

Our rules for hand washing today are aimed toward preventing disease, but we can easily fall into the same habit as these Pharisees did. We can focus more on what’s on the “outside”—the culture or the actions of other people—rather than facing the sinful desires in our hearts. After all, it’s painful to see just how capable we are of falling into sin. It’s easier just to apply a litmus test to the sins of the people around us.

Jesus came to save us from sin, and we can count on Him to give us the grace to deal with whatever is “within” us. Today, ask the Lord to search your heart. Ask Him to help you see ways in which you are susceptible to sin—and ask Him to keep cleansing you.


