

If your loved one dies and you need a sign language interpreter for Catholic funeral, AS SOON AS POS-SIBLE contact Fr. Joe at 312-685-7899 v/text. If you know of a Deaf person in the hospital or nursing home who would like his blessing, he can call them at the nursing home.

NOTES FROM FR. JOE

- ◆ "BEAUTIFUL" is the way several hearing parishioners at St. Francis Borgia described the decorations in the chapel (I agree!). Thanks to PATRICIA SLISZ, BRIAN SWATEK, JOHN & VALENTINA FOLERZYNSKI (who also collected the flower donations).
- ◆ COVID FUNERAL RE-IMBUR SEMENT: The US Government (FEMA) will pay families up to \$9,000 for any burial costs of a person who died because of COVID. You can contact the funeral director who handled the funeral, and that funeral director can help you file the necessary forms.
- ◆ COVID IS not GOING AWAY. Continue to...wear masks...use hand sanitizer...drink enough water...get enough rest...try NOT to gather in large crowds... GET VACCINATED (it is NOT too late!).
- ◆ NEXT SUNDAY, 1/16: St. Julie parish will have a special day celebrating VIETNAMESE CATHOLIC PEOPLE! The deaf are very welcome to join the community for the 6pm Mass. Fr. Joe will be there, too.
- ◆ DRIVERS!!! Children are returning to school this week. Slow down near ALL schools. Keep your headlights/taillights clean during the winter.
- ◆ PLEASE pick up your 2022 Church Envelopes. Your support for St. Francis Borgia Deaf Center is important.
- Our COVID rules continue at St. Francis Borgia Deaf Center: Must use hand sanitizers. Must wear masks. Holy Communion in your hands ONLY. Please make sure to wash your hands if you go to the washroom, soap and warm water. (Parents, remind your children.) If you feel sick, stay home and rest.

The Art Institute of Chicago has a new initiative until March 17 that allows Illinois residents FREE ADMISSION on Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays. All you need to do is show proof of residency with a zip code and address and **register on-line in advance**. Here's more info:

Message from Margaret Swatek, Religious Education Reporter Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (John 2:1-11) In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no more wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from - although the severs who had drawn the water knew - the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

REFLECTING

Parents, grandparents, and other family members anticipate the Baptism of a child with joy. Through the sacrament, the baby becomes an adopted child of God. This is a special time when the true holiness of an individual is illuminated in the light of the Holy Spirit. Bathed in the baptismal waters, we enter the Church. With the support of the faith community, the relationship of the Christian is nurtured and the individual brings the light of Christ to the world.
