

Message from Margaret Swatek, Religious Education Reporter The Miracle at Cana 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

A miracle is a sign of God's power and glory, a remarkable and amazing event that cannot be explained. Today we hear how Jesus performed His first miracle by changing water into wine. (John 2:1-11)

Jesus and His mother, along with His disciples, were invited to a wedding in a town called Cana. There was food to eat and wine to drink, and the celebrations carried on throughout the evening. Then Mary came to Jesus and said, "Son, there is no more wine for the guests to drink."

"Why do you ask for help when my time has not yet come?" Jesus asked, but Mary turned to the servants and said to them, "Do whatever Jesus tells you." Nearby stood six very large water jars, and Jesus told the servants to fill them with water. "Now, pour some out and take it to the head waiter," He said.

The water had been changed to wine! After tasting it, the head waiter went to the bridegroom and said, "Sir, you have certainly saved the very best wine until last."

The celebration carried on, and there was plenty of wine for everyone. Those who knew what Jesus had done were filled with wonder by this sign of His power.
