NOTES FROM FR. JOE

- JAN 24TH is the feast day of St. Francis De Sales (1567-1622), the patron saint of deaf people. He wrote many prayers, but this one is very special: "Be at peace. Do not look forward in fear to the changes of life; rather look at the changes with full hope as they arise. God, whose very own you are, will deliver you from out of them. God has kept you safe so far, and God will lead you safely through all things; and when you cannot stand the stress anymore, God will carry you in His arms. Do not fear what may happen tomorrow, the same everlasting Father who cares for you today will take care of you then and every day. God will either shield you from suffering, or give you unfailing strength to handle it. Be at peace, and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations."

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of Him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where He had grown up, and went according to His custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, He handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at Him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

<u>REFLECTING</u>

After proclaiming the passage from Isaiah, Jesus announces that He is the one the prophet had foretold. Can you imagine the response of His audience? Do you think that they had a hard time believing the messiah was in their midst? Would they want to wait for another to come? Have there been times that it is hard to believe that God is in your midst?
