*Hope for Today  
A Reflection*

With well over 250 Hope for **Today** messages “under my belt” since its inauguration in March, I am taking a moment to reflect upon the very title of the series.

Hope for **Today**.

Notice that these messages are not titled, “Hope for Tomorrow” or “Hope for the Next Week.” I intentionally called these notes, “Hope for **Today**.”

The “Big Crazy” has challenged all of us. Whether in illness or quarantine resulting from the virus, or in the many consequences from the pandemic, the “Big Crazy” (a term which I wished I had copyrighted!) has been impactful.

**Today** is all we have, a seemingly canned or corny notion to a few, I suppose. And while there are many happenings which are out of our control, you and I have a daily (hourly?) choice to make in terms of our response. Always with the grace of God, our reactions to those happenings can be positive or negative and often are somewhere in between.

The series was intended to offer support for YOUR **daily** encounter with hope. The notes have been constructed around a reflection upon the Readings of the Day with a dose of humor and irony added.

Fortunately, the Readings are always profound in their meaning. My use of humor sometimes falls a bit short!

My editors, first Michael Raymer and now Sheryl Krieger, advise me that the Hope for Today series is sent to well over 1,000 electronic mailboxes. If you are receiving the message today, consider yourself a subscriber!

The series has also had an unintended result: of introducing a pastor who agreed to a particular assignment (ST. MICHAEL’S!) for what turned out to a period of 8 months before the beginning of the Big Crazy. Who knew (OK---God did!)?

I am mindful that the Big Crazy is still with us even with the arrival of small stocks of a vaccine. The aftershocks (economic, social, educational, and so on) will be with us for awhile.

Let us find hope each day. Whether in recalling our blessings (gratitude) or in accompanying those most impacted by the Big Crazy, hope is discovered. Whether experienced as individuals or families or in community working for the common good, hope is realized.

## Good News - Around the Parish

**In-Person Weekend Liturgy Attendance Up:** We are averaging 374 in-person participants (19 weeks of data) at our three weekend Masses. This number compares to a baseline of 250 over 4 Masses experienced at the “reopening” on May 23-24. Attendance at the 10am Mass has continued to climb. The baseline-to-the new average increase is nearly 70%.

**School Ministry Enrollment:** We presently enroll 557 JK-8th grade students, plus 78 Pre-schoolers, which exceeds our budgeted enrollment target. In the first quarter, 10% of our children received instruction via NTI. The requested number for the second was 5%. For the period beginning November 30 and continuing through January 8, all students will receive NTI instruction.

**Sacraments:** Over the last three months, we have baptized 29 young ones with an additional 2 planned for next weekend (I do not have a benchmark for comparative purposes, at this moment). We also offered First Holy Communion to 75 children at special Masses held this fall. Opportunities for the Sacrament of Confirmation are just around the corner (at special Masses on January 17, 24, and 31) and 75 young people are expected to engage in this important sacrament.

**Social Outreach:** The Thanksgiving collection drive was hugely successful and an estimated 200+ households will be offered a meal as a result of donated generosity. Project Hope, inaugurated early in the pandemic, has delivered over 500 individual “goodie bags” since its inception. We have also maintained our commitment to assisting those in need including monetary or material donations to our friends at JAM, Sister Visitors’ Center and Hildegard House, among others.

**Music and Worship:** The average number of “views” for our streaming of a Sunday Mass has remained constant at 400. Our innovative worship ministry has also established a series of “Musical Moments” videos which have received amazing feedback. While restrictions have been imposed upon vocal singing, we have been blessed with the sharing of the musical gifts of a committed core of instrumentalists and cantors.

**Youth Ministry:** Our exceptional youth ministry program was recently highlighted in *The Record*. In-person programs, on-line approaches to catechesis, and service opportunities represent the tip of the iceberg of success here.

**Child Care (ESC):** We presently serve over 100 children in one or more of our ESC programs. From the “cradle room” to the “cry room”, the ESC has been able to maintain and expand (with renovations to facilities) its reach.


**Finance, Operations and Administration:** Our parish stewardship drive is ongoing but already we have received over 100 stewardship forms (compared to the same period a year ago) from parishioners offering time, talent and treasure gifts to St. Michael’s. Our new Chief Operating Officer, Ms. Kelly Collard, has been instrumental in keeping the “business of church” on track.



# Adult Formation Survey: Summary of Results


## 1. Age

83.1% of respondents were 40 years or older split almost evenly those with ages between 40 and 59 and those over the age of 60 (42% of all respondents).




## 2. Frequency of Mass Attendance

Over half of all respondents (51.4%) reported attending Mass on a weekly basis. Another 42.3% reported either participating using St. Michael's YouTube Channel (35.1% overall) or another on-line platform (7.2%).




## 3. Children in School?

Over 71% reported that they did not have children presently enrolled in St. Michael's school ministry.



## 4. Children Enrolled in religious education, CCD classes at St. Michael?

Nearly 84% reported that they did not have children present enrolled in CCD or other non-school ministry-affiliated religious education programs.



## 5. Interests

Respondents often marked more than one interest.


The highest rated category was "Catholic spirituality (saints, prayers, the Psalms)" at 27.6% of all responses.

This was followed by:

- "Scripture" (historical development of Sacred Scripture, the Gospels, St. Paul's writings): 23.1%
- "Elements of worship" (the structure of the Mass; the liturgical year; "who do Catholics do that"): 18.6%
- "Church history" (early Christianity; monasticism; the Vatican II era): 16.1%
- "Catholic fundamentals" (sacraments; the Creed; the Trinity): 14.6%


## 6. In-person or On-line?

55.8% preferred to meet on-line (ZOOM, Meet Up). 44.2% preferred to meet in-person




## 7. Time Commitment

Nearly half (48.7%) responded that they would be willing to spend roughly an hour or less weekly with formation activities. 20.4% expressed a willingness to spend two or three hours on a weekly basis.




## 8. Convenient Times

28.4% expressed a preference for either a Wednesday night or another evening time. 25.7% reported a preference for 9am on Sundays (between the two Masses). 23.9% said, "immediately following daily Mass."
