
There are, of course, many forms of prayer. Recitation of the Rosary is one which resonates with some. Silent prayer, before the Blessed Sacrament or at home, is yet another. Reading from the Book of Psalms and reflecting upon a transcendent message embedded in one is certainly a fruitful act of prayer.

During this Lenten Season (and always), each of us are called to prayer. Lent is a graced time to deepen a sense of our status as baptized people---as folks seeking to follow our Lord more closely.

Your parish sponsors many opportunities for prayer. The pinnacle of prayer is found in our weekend liturgies. Whether viewing virtually or participating in-person, regular Mass attendance is essential to our spiritual growth.

Perhaps this can be a time to dust off that book or pamphlet which we have been meaning to read. Thomas Merton is always a good source and most certainly Pope Francis' reflections come to mind. Reflecting upon the Readings of the Day is also a prime resource.

Stations of the Cross will also be made available on-line through the parish. This devotion, which has a long history in the Church, calls us to 14 separate recollections on Christ's Passion and Death. It can be practiced at home, too!






The Round Wooden Table

This table is in the center of our Gathering Space as you enter through the front doors. It was made by Weberding's Carving Shop in Batesville, Indiana, which specializes in church furniture. They have made other items for us as well (more on these in future updates!).

When the decision was made to build our church, much had to be planned and discussed before construction could take place! The New Church Planning Committee hired an architect, JRA Architects; and after many long discussions, a location was chosen. The site had many trees and the property also included a huge ravine. First up, we had to clear the trees. Our architect suggested we save the biggest tree, with the thought that we could build some of our church furniture from it. So, a huge white oak was selected and hauled to the Weberding's shop.

It was decided the table would be round and placed in the Gathering Space to give our entrance a focal point. It's currently used as a place to put our bulletins, seasonal hand-outs, and an eye catching center piece, provided by our Arts and Environment Ministry. The "round" table would be representative of our parish logo, a welcoming circle. By using the wood from our property, we kept a connection to our roots!

Learning About Hunger Problems in El Salvador and How CRS Rice Bowl Helps Them

Some young people in Ahuachapán in eastern El Salvador think that being a farmer is a thing of the past. Their families have farmed for generations, but climate change and soil erosion have caused harvests—and therefore, their incomes—to shrink considerably.

Edwin Carlos, a 17-year-old eager to support his parents and two little brothers, did not see farming in his future. However, after a teacher told him about how new techniques and technology were changing the way farming was being done to help restore the environment, he changed his mind. Edwin Carlos decided to join a group of 220 students who are learning skills like the importance of distancing when plowing and how burning harvest residue can harm the land and air.

Sadly, El Salvador has lost 75% of its rich land because of the large number of trees that have been cut down and harmful agricultural practices like the extensive use of fertilizers, making it one of the most food-insecure countries in the hemisphere.

“He who knows has an obligation to act,” says Edwin Carlos, who now knows how to use water properly so that it is not wasted, and organic manure and other resources to provide nutrients to the soil to produce more—and healthier—crops.

Thanks to this school program, CRS’ Raíces Ahuachapán, Edwin Carlos has also learned how to grow vegetables at home—knowledge that was extremely important during the COVID-19 pandemic. In the days of the confinement, nearly 1,200 families started home vegetable gardens to grow nutritious foods like onions, tomatoes, cucumbers and squash. They can eat what they harvest or sell the produce at their church or the local market for additional income.

Pope Francis reminds us that “young people demand change. They wonder how anyone can claim to be building a better future without thinking of the environmental crisis.” Thanks to programs like CRS’ Raíces Ahuachapán, young people are becoming active agents of that change.

Pupusas de Queso con Curtido y Salsa Roja Recipe

Curtido

- ✦ ½ head of cabbage, shredded
- ✦ 1 large carrot, grated
- ✦ ½ medium yellow onion, thinly sliced
- ✦ ½ c vinegar
- ✦ ¼ c water
- ✦ ½ t salt
- ✦ 1 t dried oregano
- ✦ ½ to 1 t red pepper flakes

Salsa Roja

- ✦ 3 medium tomatoes, chopped, or 1 15-oz can of tomatoes
- ✦ ¼ c onion, chopped
- ✦ 1 clove garlic, chopped
- ✦ 1 small jalapeño pepper, seeded and chopped
- ✦ ¼ c cilantro, chopped
- ✦ 1 t dried oregano
- ✦ ½ c water

Pupusas

- ✦ 2 c masa
- ✦ 1 pinch of salt
- ✦ 1½ c water
- ✦ 1 c queso fresco or farmer’s cheese, grated
- ✦ 1 T fair trade olive oil

Curtido: Combine the cabbage, carrot and onion in a large bowl. In a separate bowl, mix in remaining ingredients. Pour over the cabbage mixture and stir. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours, preferably 1 day before serving.

Salsa Roja: Combine all ingredients except water in a blender. Add half a cup of water and blend until smooth. Add more water as needed to make salsa smooth.

Pupusas: Combine the masa harina, salt and water in a mixing bowl. Knead to form a smooth, moist dough with a playdough-like consistency. If the mixture is too dry, gradually add more water. If it is too sticky, gradually add more masa harina.

Using wet hands, form the dough into 8 balls about 2 inches in diameter. Using your thumb, make an indentation into one of the balls, forming a small cup, and fill with 1 tablespoon of cheese. Wrap the dough to seal the cheese. Pat the dough to form a round disk about a quarter inch thick. Repeat with the remaining dough.


Heat a lightly oiled skillet over medium-high heat. Cook the pupusas on each side until golden brown. Serve warm with curtido and salsa roja.


