## This Sunday's Scripture - May 14, 2023

#### One in the Spirit

We are preparing for the Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. The readings today remind us that Jesus is a gentle teacher who guides and prepares His disciples. Knowing that His time on earth was coming to an end Jesus tells His disciples, tells us, that He will always be with us. He will not leave us on our own. He will send an advocate, one to animate our lives and provide wisdom for continued life in Christ. The Holy Spirit is active and present within us through our Baptism and Confirmation, two of the three Sacraments of Initiation. As we are received into the Church, we receive the Holy Spirit who's gifts will help us to walk as disciples of Jesus all of our lives. The first reading demonstrates how the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation were entrusted to the early Church and passed on through the ages. Just as disciples in the first century, we are gifted with the Holy Spirit and choose daily to listen. How will you choose to listen to the Holy Spirit this week?

The gift of the Holy Spirit bears fruit in our lives. As we listen and act in the name of Jesus Christ our actions boast of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control, and goodness. Our lives and the lives of those we encounter grow in holiness...are sanctified. When we choose to listen to the Holy Spirit our words and deeds become the light of Christ which shines like a beacon of hope.

The Holy Spirit, our advocate, is the person of the Holy Trinity who aids us in loving God, following God's commands, and living a life of discipleship. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are graces in our lives which help us to know and love Jesus until we are joined fully with Him in Heaven. Jesus did not leave us orphans on the day of His Ascension. He is always with us, guiding us and loving us, through the works of the Holy Spirit. The advocate, made present to us through Baptism and Confirmation. May we always choose to listen to the stirrings of the Holy Spirit in our lives. May we choose to be Christ-like in the Kingdom that reigns on earth.

# Why is May the Month of Mary?

The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Mary, came about in the 13<sup>th</sup> century. Some say because it was created to replace various pagan cults. The actual reason is the fact that this month is

the time when spring is at the height of its beauty. Spring is also connected with nature renewing itself. In her way, Mary gave new life to the world when she gave birth to our saviour Jesus Christ. The link between Mary and the month of May became popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it had a firm hold among their students at the Roman College and a short time later it was publicly celebrated in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the rest of the Church. The pious practice of honouring Mary during the month of May has been especially promoted by the Popes. Pius XII made frequent reference to it and in his great Encyclical on the Sacred Liturgy Mediator Dei. He characterized it as one of "other exercises of piety which although not strictly belonging to the Sacred Liturgy, are nevertheless of special import and dignity, and may be considered in a certain way to be an addition to the liturgical cult: they have been approved and praised over and over again by the Apostolic See and by the Bishops"Devotion to Mary is one an important part of the Catholic identity. As our mother she is an example of a committed "Yes" to the will of God. Because of the devotion to her many people ask her for help in the most difficult moments of their life as any child does with his mother.








## Men's Bible Study

The event is free and open to the public.




## <u>"Laudato Si' and the</u> U.S. Catholic Church" Conference






