## AAC UPDATE: PLEASE READ

It has been brought to my attention that some members are finding the newsletters and information available about the AAC confusing or incomplete. I will do my best to explain what is going on behind the scenes. I am sorry for any confusion and hope this will help clear things up!

### **When will the AAC reopen?**

The short answer is that we will reopen when it is determined SAFE for seniors to gather in **this** building. Many considerations factor into this decision. What is the covid-19 percentage and rate of spread in the county? What are the federal and state government and Health Department(s) guidelines at the time? What is the status of the vaccine? Statistics, recommendations, common sense, commitment, caring.

### **Who will decide?**

Franklin Mayor Steve Barnett and Parks and Rec Superintendent Chip Orner. The decision will be based on recommendations from Governor Holcomb and the Indiana State Department of Health as well as the Johnson County Health Department.

### **Why is the activities section still included in the monthly newsletter even though we are closed?**

The newsletter's purpose is to update you with what is going on at the AAC on a monthly basis, but it also serves as a resource guide for the community at large and potential members. We have received numerous phone calls from seniors who are interested in joining the AAC when we reopen, and the newsletter helps them understand what to expect during "normal" times. In addition, individuals/groups who are potential sponsors of AAC activities read the newsletter to see if their organization would be a fit as an activities sponsor or partner at the AAC. We are always adding new partners!

### **Can the AAC open to distribute bread and packaged goods?**

No. Since we aren't officially "open" we don't receive bread anymore, nor are there packaged goods available for us to give you. We have shared food from our pantry with AAC members and other community organizations to help seniors over these past months. Contact Johnson County Senior Services for food.

### **Why are other Indiana Senior Centers open when the AAC is closed?**

Because their decision makers have determined, based on their current situation, that it is safe for them to open. Some centers are much smaller, so they have fewer members to "social distance"; others are larger, so social distancing is easier for them. Many centers are **NOT** open, or offer virtual activities only, and most of the ones that **are** open limit days, activities, and number of participants. All wear masks, social distance, require pre-registration for ALL activities (no drop-ins), and **must** follow the Governor's guidelines. (Or be in violation).

## AAC UPDATE (CONTINUED)

### I need help with food. Is there a food pantry for seniors?

**Johnson County Senior Services** (317.738.4544) provides food to seniors. They sponsor a senior food pantry and are the designated organization for food distribution Johnson County seniors . (See page 5). They have recently moved to their new location in Whiteland, but they provide food and other services to **all** Johnson County seniors.

### What can the AAC offer me while the center is closed?

A monthly newsletter (on-line) and monthly mailer to your home, books, puzzles, dvds & masks on Wednesdays (you must call ahead and let us know you are coming), help with resource connection (food, other needs) and more. While it isn't practical to call everyone on a regular basis, we are happy to answer and respond to your needs and questions when you call. **We can't know what you need until you tell us!** Everyone's situation is different. Some stay home, some go out, some have family members to help them, others don't., etc If you need help we will do our best to help. Please remember to leave a message!



**Because the virus continues to spread, attendance at senior centers is currently at all time low, even in those that are technically “open.” It may look like we are dragging our feet, but trust me, we are not! We are continually working on putting plans in place that will help us open safely and effectively as soon as we are given the green light! Remember, when we do open we will be following all guidelines recommended at that time. This will likely include many of the following: wearing masks at all times, social distancing 6 feet apart, limiting the number of activities and members, opening limited days and hours, taking temperatures at the door or other door screening measures, no drop-ins (all members must make reservations in advance), etc. But hang in there! We will get through this and we will be together and exercising (totally new program) and “bingo-ing” sooner than we might think! In the meantime please call us if you have needs or questions. We are still available!**




