MASS INTENTIONS

Hello everybody,

First let me offer a shoutout to everyone who volunteered, attended, and supported the St. Joe's picnic. Thank you for your support! Secondly, a friendly reminder of the Corpus Christi procession next Sunday. May we walk with our Lord through the streets proclaiming the truth of the Eucharist! What a wonderful opportunity for us to witness our faith to our community. Lastly, another sincere thank you to everyone who offered cards, gifts, and well wishes for my birthday. It's hard to believe I'm another year older but I am so thankful to all of those who have offered kindness.

On this feast day of the Holy Trinity, we celebrate the mystery of one God: the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Three persons, but God is one! The Father is God; the Son is God; the Spirit is God. But they are not three gods: it is one God in three Persons. It is a mystery that Jesus Christ revealed to us: the Holy Trinity. Today we pause to celebrate this mystery, because the Persons are not adjectives of God, no. They are real, diverse, different Persons. There is the Father to whom we pray with the Our Father; there is the Son, who is present to us in the Eucharist; there is the Holy Spirit who abides in us and inhabits the Church.

All three Persons speak to our heart; as the great evangelist Saint John proclaimed in his summarization of all revelation: "God is love." The Father is love; the Son is love; the Holy Spirit is love. Inasmuch as God is love, while being one alone, God is never solitude but always communion: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Because love is essentially a gift of self, and in its original and infinite reality it is the Father who gives himself by generating his Son, who in turn gives himself to the Father, and their mutual love is the Holy Spirit, the bond of their unity. The three distinct Persons proclaim the necessity of community for love. May that serve as a model for us to always cultivate relationships of love with God, our family, and community.
