

This week has been such a beautiful one. From starting with a Corpus Christi procession, to celebrating Father's Day, and being able to reunite with the priests of the Diocese at Priest Unity Days, this has been such a great week. If that's not enough, I was blessed to be able to celebrate my 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as a priest on Thursday! Then of course to top it all off, Deacon Steven Weller, who you may remember from living at the parish in 2020, became Fr. Weller on Saturday! Wow, so many grace filled moments and blessing.

If that isn't enough, the Lord continues to shower his grace and mercy upon us through the gift of our Sunday liturgies. Returning to Ordinary Time, we resume our carefully structured (ordered) study of Sacred Scripture. Picking up from where we left off last February, we return to the Holy Gospel of Luke to encounter Christ. This week we are treated with the great story of Christ entering a Samaritan village to less than a warm reception. Though he is rejected by the people, he does not give up. He does not turn to anger or disappointment, but continues to be that beacon of light and hope. Not only proclaiming the love of Christ, but encouraging those around him not give into selfishness, but embrace selflessness.

Our Gospel concludes in an odd way, some may even say heartless. The man is stating that he must put his earthly father first, before his heavenly. What Jesus is teaching is that we all must commit our hearts fully to following the Lord. We can always come up with excuses for not following Christ. Work, family, and other obligations do indeed impact our life. However, we are called to follow the path of Jesus. How often do we make excuses to miss mass, embrace anger, hold grudges, or skip prayer because of our family? We can always come up with so many excuses to not follow Jesus, sometimes even using our family as the reason. May we strive to stay close to Jesus, then perhaps we can lead our family closer to Christ.






As we celebrate Father's 10th Anniversary of Ordination, here are few pictures from 10 years ago!

The only way this can be fixed is surgically. On June 28, I will have surgery on my right eye to implant a new lens. The doctor is anticipating a two week physical recovery, and a three month visual recover. Any prayers that you can offer would be greatly appreciated.





Next weekend, July 2 & 3, we will welcome Rev. Joseph Albert as he joins us for our annual Mission Cooperative Appeal for the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore.

The Madras-Mylapore Archdiocese, established in 1952 has a population of 12 million, out of which 420,000 are Catholics. Around 300 Priests, 500 Religious with the support of Catechists and youth, are involved in direct and indirect evangelization through various Missionary works in this predominantly Hindu and Muslim dominated society.

With the Mission Cooperative Appeal collection, the Archdiocese hopes to complete setting up the "Holy Family Spiritual Centre." This center will help those facing marriage challenges and family problems through counseling, therapy and spiritual direction.

Offering envelopes to be used for the collection for the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore will be available next weekend.
