

# Words of Worship: Creating a Culture of Encounter

Part 1 of 5 in this series from the USCCB, adapted from their *Creating a Culture of Encounter: A Guide for Joyful Missionary Disciples* resource guide

"The main goal of Creating a Culture of Encounter is to discern ways in which the local Church can better respond to those who live on the peripheries of society and foster ways in which the faithful can respond, as missionary disciples, to the call of the New Evangelization, serving the whole Church." (CCE, p. 1)

### Session 1: Called to a Loving Encounter with Jesus in the Church

### INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the first session of the Encounter process. In these five parts we will make our own journey with Jesus, following the various moments of the passage of Emmaus. We will also prepare to reach out to those who most need to hear the Good News of Jesus and feel the loving embrace of the Church. In this first session, we will focus on how Jesus reaches out to the disciples, taking the first step in coming forth to meet them.

### SCRIPTURE READING

### Luke 24:13-15

Now that very day two of them were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem, called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.

### SEE

Let us consider a moment in our personal history:

Share an experience in which you felt Jesus took the initiative to reach out to you.

- What were the blindfolds that prevented you from recognizing Jesus (e.g., tiredness, worries, the need to survive, the lack of reflection, isolation . . . )?
- Who was walking by me?
- Who or what restored my hope?

### JUDGE

God seeks us out first through the Sacrament of Baptism and calls us to be missionary disciples of God's divine love. Jesus invites all the baptized to seek others out first and gives us the Holy Spirit to guide our joyful steps.

How do you reach out to others under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit?


### ACT

How could we prepare ourselves for mission, what steps should we take, what gestures should we make to be the hands, the feet, and the eyes of God in the world?

### MISSIONARY ACTION

Take the initiative to reach out to someone. Ask simple questions showing interest in the person. Do not start by giving instructions, advice, or talking about doctrine, but by listening intently. The first objective is to join them along their journey and become attuned to their lives.

## **CEF TUITION ASSISTANCE APPLICATION**

The Catholic Education Foundation, the Archdiocese of Louisville, and their funding partners are helping more families than ever who need assistance paying the full cost of educating their children in a Catholic elementary school. All families with one or more children enrolled in or applying to a Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese of Louisville are eligible to apply.

Please note, that the application window for tuition assistance is earlier this year. Tuition assistance applications must be submitted between <u>November 15, 2021 and January 31, 2022</u>. A single form through the FACTS management system will be used for all types of Catholic elementary school tuition assistance, available through their website at www.ceflou.org. Please note, you must submit your 2020 federal income tax return and 2020 W-2 information. This earlier application process will allow CEF to alert families of assistance awards at an earlier date, no later than <u>May 1, 2022</u>.

## UPDATE ON FRONT STEPS WITH KOETTER CONSTRUCTION

Just prior to the Christmas holiday, members of the Saint Agnes staff and the Building & Grounds Committee met with Koetter Construction to evaluate the completion of the construction projects that finished this year on campus. Also addressed was the state of the steps in front of the church after the previous repair did not hold up. Koetter Construction promised the situation with the steps would be resolved, even if it means tearing them out and starting from scratch at their own expense. Whatever the solution, Koetter will make sure it takes place at the right time seasonally to ensure we don't have another situation where the concrete is poured when it is too hot, leading to the issues we have seen today. Additionally,



Koetter has already been on-site repairing areas on the bottom area of the plaza where settling had occurred. Additional information will be communicated when a solution is found, and all parties are ready to move forward with the project.



## PRESCHOOL PLAYGROUND ADDITION

While construction on our two new buildings have long been finished, you may have noticed new construction fencing up in the parking lot while visiting the Saint Agnes campus recently. After several shipment delays for the equipment due to the ongoing supply chain disruption, we have finally been able to move forward with the building of the Preschool playground. Until this point, our youngest students have been able to play on the blacktop and used their imaginations to the fullest extent while playing in the empty lot. 
