JUNE 11, 2023 | SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

<u>Take and Drink</u> - This Sunday the Chalice of Precious Blood is returning for the congregation in most parishes of the archdiocese including St. Agnes. The cup was suspended out of an abundance of caution in 2020. The Church has always taught that Christ, with his soul and divinity exists under both species of bread and wine. And "Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread [or wine] alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace."

At the same time the Church says, "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord..." And "as Christ offered His whole self, Body and Blood, as a sacrifice for our sins, so too is our reception of His Body and Blood under both kinds an especially fitting participation in the memorial of His eternal life."

It is entirely up to each person whether to receive communion from one or both species. The consensus in the CDC is that there is a theoretical risk of disease transmission though a common communion cup, but the risk is so small that it hasn't been seen in any peer reviewed studies. No disease outbreak has ever been traced to a common communion cup. Of course, individuals who are ill are asked to refrain from the cup.

We are pleased to be able to offer the precious blood to the entire congregation (the liturgy requires the celebrant and concelebrants receive from the cup) and hope that everyone will partake in this "especially fitting" way as they feel comfortable.

I also want to invite more parishioners to participate as Eucharist ministers. We will need an additional two or four Eucharistic ministers each Mass. This is usually my favorite part of Mass, this opportunity to greet people, recognize Christ in the bread and the wine, and in them, and to see them depart as living tabernacles of God. I often find it a great joy. So I invite you to consider putting a little more joy in your life. Please contact Pam Slagle if you are interested. Deacon Trey
