CATHOLIC COMEBACK CONTINUES

The rows of chairs will not be reconfigured at this time. There is more than enough seating for those who are coming to Mass.

Masks will be required on the **east half (tabernacle side)** of the church. Social distancing should be maintained within rows.

Masks are optional on the **west half (ambo side)** of the church). Though social distancing is not required, please consider that the people in your row may prefer a slightly larger personal space. There is no need to crowd each other.

It is regrettable that the division of the church into halves may displace you from the area in which you would prefer to sit. Let's consider this a small price to pay for the loosening of restrictions.

We will continue to bring communion to you at your seats. Ministers of the eucharist will wear masks.

Other minor changes will take effect over time and will be explained if necessary.

Common sense and courtesy will go a long way. If you prefer not to wear a mask but find yourself for any length of time in the proximity of someone who is wearing one, please consider putting one on. Be patient with those who may forget the guidelines. Let us strive to outdo one another in showing respect.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK



The immensity, scope, intimacy, and pervasiveness of God's presence is too intense for the human mind. We often limit God by our expectations of Him and have a hard time just letting God be God. Some people all too easily lose faith because God does not meet their expectations. Worse still, the idea of faith is rejected altogether by others because of polarities and experiences they have that don't square with who they need God to be. The Holy Trinity is one of those teachings that is best encountered rather than dissected. It is only through being present with the Trinity that we can experience both the immensity and otherness of God's presence as well as the intimacy of the God who wants us to call Him "dad." We feel the loving guidance of a God who wants to take us from fear and give us confidence. Our God of yesterday, today, and tomorrow is a God of all ages whose three-fold Presence invades all senses, seasons, and times. God, who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is much more than any of our expectations if we simply let God be who God is.

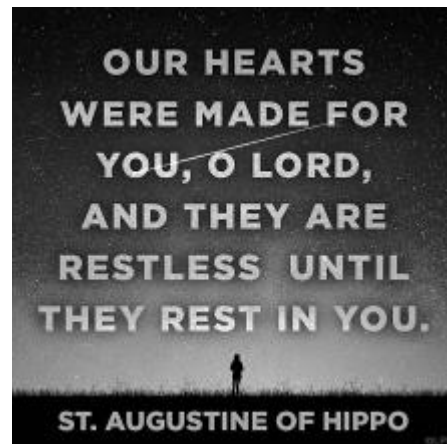

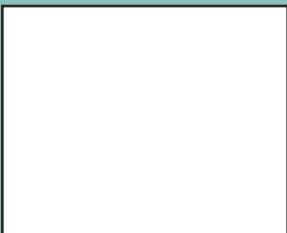

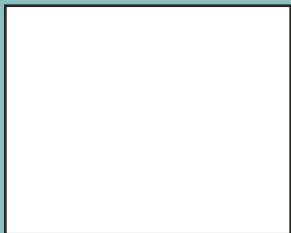
