This weekend we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. I want to thank our teachers and all of our catechists who help to teach the faith to our young people and those in RCIA.








I might encourage just one parent to attend so we maintain social distancing that is required by the CDC guidelines. Also, masks are required for those who have not been fully vaccinated.


PRAYER FOR A NEW ARCHBISHOP

SFA FINANCIAL SUMMARY

SFA FINANCIAL SUMMARY Fiscal Year End 7/2020-6/30/2021

FINANCIAL RESULTS

Total Support and other revenue, excluding Capital Campaign, Payroll Protection Loan, KY Cares Act Grants, Unrealized Gain/Loss on Investments and Interest from Investments totaled, \$2,244,056. Total Expenses, excluding transfers and Capital Campaign items, totaled \$2,402,304. This is a net **decrease of \$158,248.**

As of June 30th, 2021, the PNC Legacy Account is valued at \$394,431; the value June 30th, 2020, was \$173,052, a net **increase of \$221,379.** This increase is a combination of market gains and reinvestments into the account.

INCOME/EXTRORDINARY INCOME

St. Francis received a total of \$103,693 in KY Cares grants. These grants offset the loss of revenue for Pre-K and After School Care as we were not permitted to be at full capacity due to COVID-19 restrictions. Our Payroll Protection Loan of \$350,200 was forgiven. This loan was used to cover salaries and benefits during the COVID-19 shutdown. Gains in the Market and Re-Investment in Legacy Fund totaled \$124,599. Net collections for the year totaled \$454,629; **\$46,999 less** than our budgeted amount of \$501,628 but an increase from last year's collections of \$447,028. We received \$106,414 from the Catholic Education Foundation which helped many families with tuition assistance.

FUNDRAISING

Due to COVID-19 restrictions we were not able to hold our annual Fall Festival, which typically nets around \$23,000 as well as our Flamingo School Fundraiser that typically nets around \$30,000. We held a Flamingo Raffle in September 2020 in place of the March 2020 (prior fiscal year) Flamingo Fundraiser. This raffle generated approximately \$7,000 net revenue. The Parish held a Christmas Split the Pot Raffle that generated approximately \$8,000 in net revenue. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, St. Francis hosted "drive-thru" Fish Fry's. This was actually a great success as the Parish netted \$7,500.

SCHOOL TUITION AND ENROLLMENT

Total Tuition revenue for Pre-K through 8th grades, including the Barton Learning Program for the year is \$1,597,072. This is slightly above our budgeted amount of \$1,594,907. Enrollment for Pre-K and Barton Learning Program is 12 and 10, respectively. Pre-K budgeted 14; however, COVID-19 restrictions only allowed 12. Barton Program was on budget. Enrollment for Kindergarten through 8th grade is 244, compared to a budget of 243.

EXPENSES

Most Parish expenses have remained relatively consistent over the past five years. However, overall expenses decreased in the following areas:

Payroll decreased slightly from prior year due to staffing changes and a slight decrease in health insurance.

Pastor Rent decreased as Father Chandler moved into the rectory in February 2021

We had slight decreases in Liturgy Supplies, Instructional Supplies, Activities and Assessments.

Archdiocese refunded 1% of Yearly Assessment back to all the Parishes. St. Francis received \$25,075.

Plant and Grounds increased slightly due to boiler/chiller repairs and additional cleaning/sanitization supplies.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

2020/2021 Fiscal Year Capital Campaign donations totaled \$318,586. Our Pledge Donations are averaging 84% to our pledges. St. Francis of Assisi was approved for a construction loan of \$800,000. This loan is on track to be paid off in 7 years. As you can see, the work has begun! The roof work on the church and school building is currently taking place. The rectory roof will begin in early August, and the exterior painting on all buildings will begin in September as well as church window repair/replacement will begin later in the year. There's lots of activity on our campus this summer. As always, we are thankful for the commitment of many to our wonderful parish.

SACRAMENT STATISTICS

Thanks to the financial support of parishioners, the efforts of the staff, and many volunteers, the following Sacramental events took place in 2020/2021: 20 baptisms, 55 First Eucharist/First Reconciliations, 45 Confirmations, 0-RCIA, and 13-funerals. We also added 29 new families to our parish.
