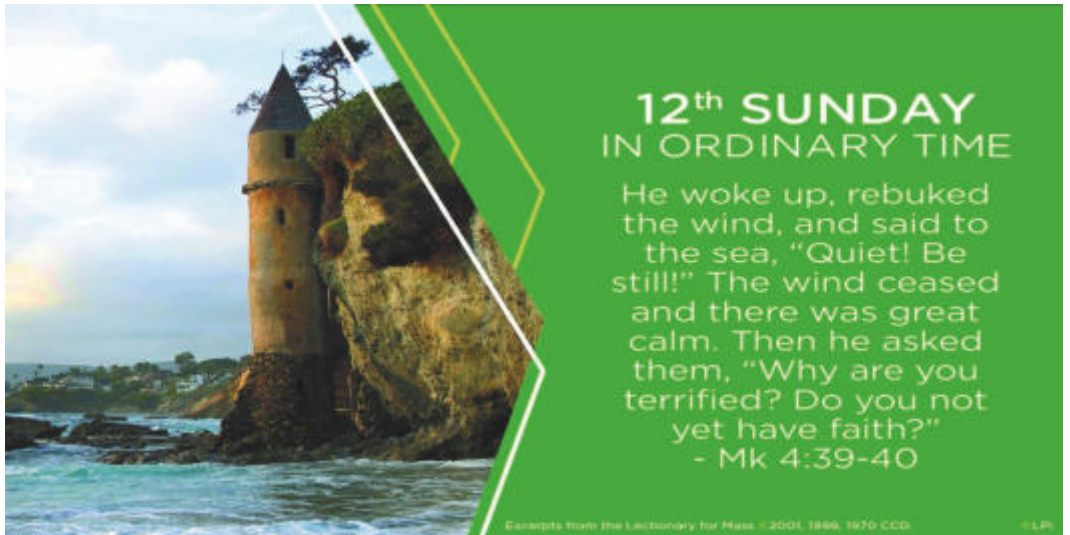

PRAYER & WORSHIP

A NOTE FROM DEACON MARK	MASS INTENTIONS
<p>As you read this deacon note, I will be in Buffalo, NY visiting my dad. The last time I saw my father in person was in December 2019. I was planning to visit him in March 2020 but something called the coronavirus caused a pandemic and I have not been able to see my dad in over a year and a half. I am glad he is still with us and that I can visit him again. His short-term memory is not the greatest and he is now living in assisted living but his humor remains strong. I mention this because as we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, June 20th, we should reflect a little on fatherhood. Though not a specific church holy day, the idea of fatherhood is important to our faith. Jesus taught us to call God our Father, since the Father is one of the Blessed Trinity. Last December 2019, Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter to mark the start of the <i>Year of St. Joseph</i>, foster father of Jesus. In this letter he briefly but pointedly spoke of a fatherhood crisis. "Fathers are not born, but made," the pope wrote. "A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child." And then added: "Children today often seem orphans, lacking fathers." Numbers seem to back this up. As of 2019, there were roughly 16 million American children — about 1 in 4 — without a father in the home.</p> <p>So what can St. Joseph teach us about this crisis in fatherhood? My thought is that if fathers can model themselves after the fatherhood of St. Joseph, then our families will be that much safer and stronger. There are many things to say about the fatherhood of St. Joseph but let's focus on only one for now, that of protector. Joseph had full responsibility for his family which was the object of King Herod's vicious hatred. He had to provide for their survival by leaving Bethlehem in the middle of the night and even by going into exile in Egypt (Matthew 2:20) and later settling in the obscurity of Nazareth, under the angel's directions (Matthew 2:22). He did what had to be done to protect the Holy Family, no matter how inconvenient. He had faith in the angel's messages and did what he believed was right. Mary gave Jesus his life and Joseph made it secure in the face of fierce threats. The redemption of the world depended on their full cooperation at this crucial time in the young Messiah's life. The lesson for fathers today is to follow St. Joseph's example- to take responsibility to protect one's family from all that would harm them, things which are clearly harmful and other threats which might be more subtle. 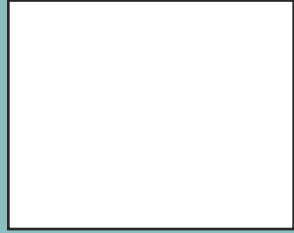
