PASTOR'S NOTES

The Nativity of the Lord & Feast of the Holy Family



In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town.

And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.

While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

Luke 2:1-7

A Happy and Blessed Christmas to one and all! We gather now for one of the most holy days of the entire year. This day, we recall the momentous moment when God was born a man from the virgin Mary. 



Find your role **IN THE FAMILY**

Parish life invites a new depth to your relationship with Jesus Christ. Highlighted here are different ministries & activities currently happening at Holy Family Parish with Covid protocols. God grants a wide variety of personalities and talents, so look and pray about where where God is calling you to engage.

Liturgical Ministers

Altar Servers - *Adam Welp, (812) 406-6117* - **Youth servers** can be any Holy Family parishioner (boys or girls) from 5th – 8th grade; they assist at the altar during Mass and for other liturgical devotions. **Adult servers** assist primarily for funerals. Training is available.

Cleaners – *Paul Stiller, ext. 4* - Cleaners help sanitize the pews and other frequently touched surfaces after weekend Masses. Time commitment is 5-10 minutes after Mass on a volunteer basis.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion - *Adam Welp, (812) 406-6117* - The role of the EMHC is to assist the priest(s) and deacon(s) in the prayerful and effective distribution of Holy Communion during Mass.

Lectors - *Mark Falkenstein, (502) 369-5158* - A lector proclaims God's living word at Masses and other liturgical gatherings where Scripture readings are included. They also read the general intercessions at Mass. A strong voice and the ability to convey the meaning of the Scriptures is necessary. Training is available.

Music Programs – *Paul Stiller, ext. 4* - Our liturgical music programs are currently limited to cantors and instrumentalists at weekend Masses. **Cantors** are the song leaders during Mass and will usually sing once or twice a month. **Instrumentalists** typically include those who know the piano, guitar, strings, and bass. If you are interested, please contact Paul Stiller for an audition, or with any questions.

Tech Team – *Kelli Reutman, ext. 223* - Tech team members livestream the Mass and other devotions from the church with our new livestream set up. Training will be provided; all that you need is an aptitude for learning new software. Time commitment would be a couple hours for training and then the time of the Mass running the cameras on a scheduled volunteer basis.

Ushers - *Fred Ernstberger, (502) 693-6928* - Ushers play a new, vital role for the parish during the pandemic. Duties include greeting and seating people before Mass and helping with the orderly flow of Holy Communion and dismissal from the church. They may also assist in handing out materials and taking up the Sunday offerings.

Faith Formation

Root Groups – *Karen Schoenfelder, ext. 0* – We are created for community and thrive when that community is born and nourished from the life of the Church. A root group is an intentional gathering, meeting regularly for the purpose of living as disciples of Jesus Christ. Groups are supported by the parish and Catalyst Catholic with resources and support.

CFF - *Theresa Shaw, ext. 5* – Catholic Faith Formation classes for students in grades K-8 who attend public school. It is held one Saturday per month (generally the 2nd) from 9:00am to 12:00pm in the Day Activity Center. This is a family-oriented program where we learn about the Bible and the doctrine of the Catholic faith, enabling parents to form their child in the Catholic Faith.

Totus Tuus / Vacation Bible School - *Theresa Shaw, ext. 5* - Holy Family is currently utilizing the Totus Tuus program offered by the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Your child will be enthralled with learning about the Catholic faith through games, skits, and other activities! The program is presented by college-age students in love with their Catholic faith.

Youth Ministry – *Abbi Hamm, ext. 227* – Holy Family Youth Ministry is centered on Christ and allows students to explore faith and life. A variety of regularly scheduled activities strengthen your child's relationships with Christ and peers through worship, catechesis, service and fellowship. Events are open to youth in grades 6-12.

Christian Service Ministries

St. Vincent dePaul Society – *Dan Schoenfelder, (812) 949-2773* - A group of individuals who work on a voluntary basis, serving the spiritual and material needs of the less fortunate. The St. Vincent dePaul Society assistance is not restricted by boundaries, but concentrates primarily on parishioners and individuals in the immediate area. Among the many activities of St. Vincent dePaul is assistance with rent, utilities, food, clothing, and other household items. The organization is funded entirely by donations from the generosity of parishioners.

In Heaven's Eyes - *David Schraffenberger, (812) 923-3629* - The mission of IHE is to show God's love by providing food, clothing, spiritual meaning, and comfort to the poor, lost and needy. Volunteers may assist in this ministry by: prayer; donating, sorting and distributing clothes, toys and blankets (in good condition); donating food; and assisting in providing brown bag lunches to the needy on Saturdays and Wednesdays. This ministry relies on donations from parishioners and benefactors.

Disaster Preparedness Planning Team - *Ron Webber, (812) 923-8621* - This team gets us prepared for the event of a disaster in the area. This also includes the possibility of Holy Family becoming a shelter site through the American Red Cross. We welcome anyone who would like to be a part of emergency preparations to join the team.

Pro-Life Committee - *Lynn Hesse, (502) 727 4153* - Promotes the truth that all life is sacred from conception to natural death by educating and informing others about the sanctity of human life. The Pro-Life Committee works closely with Right to Life of Southern Indiana, with fundraisers, community awareness, and educating youth.

Events

Wednesday Adoration - 1st & 3rd Wednesdays, 9am-9pm - All day Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Everybody is welcome to stop by at any time, or become a committed adorer by signing up for a one-hour time slot. Contact Paul Stiller in the parish office if interested.

Preached Holy Hour - Second Tuesdays, 6:30pm - Exposition and Benediction follow the 6pm Mass. Fr. Gries preaches on a different topic each month for about 30 minutes, followed by 30 minutes of silent time.

Catholic Book Club - First Mondays, 6:45pm - Theresa Shaw, ext. 5 - Join a group of parishioners that read books about our faith. This is a nice way to get to know fellow parishioners and to learn more about your faith in a nice conversational setting.

Legion of Mary - Mondays, 8:30am - Karen Stumler, (502) 974-3981 - The objective of the Legion of Mary is the sanctification of its members by prayer and active participation in the Spiritual and Corporal works of Mercy, under the guidance of the parish priest and dedicated to Mary Immaculate, Mediatrix of all Graces. All parishioners are welcome.

Video Series Studies - Sundays in Lent & Advent, 9am - Theresa Shaw, ext. 1 - Small groups meet Sunday between Masses to watch videos and discuss elements of our faith. Past topics include Divine Mercy, Jesus the Way, the Truth and the Life, and the Gospel of Mark.

Public Recitation of the Rosary - Join us for a public recitation of the Rosary in the Church every Sunday morning starting at 10:05 a.m. All are welcome!

Community Groups

Athletics - Jeff Grantz, athletics@holyfamilyeagles.com - Holy Family Athletics works with Catalyst Catholic to organize 14 different sports teams. Students from the parish and school are welcome on these teams, provided they do not play for a public school. See holyfamilyeagles.com/athletics for more information.

Boy Scouts, Troop 36 / Cub Scouts, Pack 36 - Steve Sloten, (812) 972-1740 - A Boy Scout Troop was established for boys ages 11 to 18 and a Cub Scout Pack for boys ages 5 to 10. Marriage Ministry - Fr. Jeremy Gries, ext. 1 - All Catholics, even those marrying a non-Catholic, are expected to be married in the Catholic Church or with proper ecclesial permission. If you are planning on getting married in the Catholic Church there are certain requirements you need to meet. Please contact Fr. Gries to schedule an appointment 9 to 12 months prior the wedding date and before you reserve other professional wedding services. Marriage prep need not take this whole time, but extended time for prayer and preparation is encouraged. Fr. Gries can be contacted to answer further questions and provide details of expectations.

Annulments/Divorce Ministry - Please contact Fr. Gries to receive information on the annulment process and resources if you want spiritual support for a divorce.

Sponsor Couples - Married couples that help guide and mentor engaged couples during their time of formation (6 to 9 months before the wedding). This ministry is a great service to our engaged couples because they help model the real life of living a Christian Marriage.


