After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Luke 3:21-22

The Archdiocese of Indianapolis recently issued updated Guidelines for Baptismal Preparation. There are few real changes, yet it is always a good reminder of who we are as recipients of Baptism and a Church who Baptizes.

Discipleship and Christian Living

In the Gospel of Matthew (28:19), Jesus asks his disciples to "go and make disciples..." When an infant is baptized the parents promise to raise the child according to the Catholic faith. In the Rite of Baptism, the celebrant makes this statement: "If your faith makes you ready to accept this responsibility, then, mindful of your own Baptism, renounce sin and profess faith in Christ Jesus, the faith of the Church, in which children are baptized." (cf Rite of Baptism for Several Children, no. 56) To do this well, a parent must strive to live a good Catholic life that will be an example to their child. In addition to living a good Christian life, parents must become familiar with what the Catholic Church believes and teaches. In other words, they are responsible for teaching the Faith to their children. Therefore, parents must make it a priority to continue learning about their faith throughout their life – so they may better witness to the Faith in their home and catechize their growing family, the next generation of Catholic disciples of Jesus Christ.

The Role of Godparents and the Parish Community

Parents are aided in their Christian duties by **godparents**, whose primary role is to profess the Catholic faith and serve as models of faithful Catholics. Through the personal involvement of godparents in the life of the family and the baptized child, they represent the constant presence of the Church in the life of the baptized.

The **parish** also has a role in the Sacrament of Baptism, because every child is baptized into the family of God and into the particular family of believers that is the parish, under the leadership of the local bishop (cf. Rite of Baptism for Children, no. 4). The parish also supports families by providing religious education and sacramental preparation for each child and, in many cases, offering education through the parochial school.

Here at Holy Family, when someone calls the parish office about a possible Baptism, we want to share the joy and wonder of this great Sacrament with the parent(s). We also hope and pray this future celebration will be an outflow of an existing fully engaged and energized relationship with Christ and the Church. Baptism is more than just a family custom, it is a sacred Sacrament that forever changes the one being baptized, young or old. As such, we typically expect families to be active members of our parish family with an existing prayer life, Mass participation, and upright moral life. Clearly, no one is perfect (don't I know it!), but one's outward life is a clear indication of one's interior priorities and purpose. We also recognize that the arrival of a little one can be a perfect opportunity to reevaluate one's interior priorities and purpose and start in a new direction. We want to work with families so that the time of Baptismal preparation can be a time of Faith Formation, wherever they are. The impact of Baptism continues well after the preparation and the actual Sacramental reception. So too should be the growing in faith and living out of our Baptismal Call. This happens first and most profoundly in the home with parents as the first catechist. To aid in this, godparents have a role to encourage and support the parents and their godchild.

How have you experienced the grace of your Baptism lately? What have you done recently to support the Catholic Christian Faith in your own children? Where have you reached out to your godchild(ren) to strengthen them in their Catholic Christian faith? Questions to ponder... questions to act on!


LIVE THE LITURGY




GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death,



the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.
