

PASTOR'S NOTES

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



[Darents] In asking for Baptism for your child, you are undertaking the responsibilty of raising her/him in the faith, so that keeping God's commandments, she/he may love the Lord and her / his neighbor as Christ taught us. Do you understand this responsibility?

[Godparents] are you ready to help the parents of this child in their duty?

(Order of Baptism, #77 – 78)

The above questions are asked of parents and godparents of a child to be baptized. And readily (and naively) they always answer: "We are!". Few people really understand this responsibility. Even as a pastor, I grow in the importance of my own Baptism responsibilities daily. Baptism is the 2nd most important moment in one's entire life. The moment of our conception being the first and foremost important and our death, likely the third most important. That places Baptism in a very key place. It is through Baptism that we are spiritually reborn as a son or daughter of God. This rebirth has immense and eternal consequences upon our life. From the Archdiocese of Indianapolis' updated Guidelines for Baptismal Preparation, a few of those impacts are outlined below.

Impact of Baptism – Drawn from the National Directory for Catechesis:

- Baptism is (1) the foundation of the Christian life because it is the journey into Christ's death and Resurrection, which is the foundation of our hope; (2) gives sanctifying grace, that is, God's life; (3) gives them a new birth in which they become children of God, members of Christ, and temples of the Holy Spirit; (4) cleanses people from original sin and from all personal sins; (5) incorporates them into the life, practices and mission of the Church; and (6) imprints on their souls an indelible character that consecrates them for Christian worship and is necessary for salvation in the case of all those who have heard the Gospel and have been able to ask for this Sacrament (CCC 1257)
- Baptism bestows upon us a share in the Mission of Christ as king, priest, and prophet
- Baptism "symbolizes the catechumen's burial into Christs' death, from which he rises up by resurrection with him, as 'a new creature'" (CCC 1214)
- Baptism is "the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit . . . and the door which gives access to the other sacraments" (CCC 1213)
- Baptism grants the faithful a "share in the priesthood of Christ, in his prophetic and royal mission" (CCC 1268)
- Baptism is the means by which "the Most Holy Trinity gives [to you and I] sanctifying grace, the grace of justification" (thus "the whole organism of the Christian's supernatural life has its root in baptism")
 - o "enabling them to believe in God, to hope in him, and to love him through the theological virtues"
 - o "giving them the power to live and act under the prompting of the Holy Spirit through the gifts of the Holy Spirit"
 - o "allowing them to grow in goodness through the moral virtues" (CCC 1266)
- "Having become a member of the church, the person baptized belongs no longer to himself, but to him who died and rose for us. From now on he is called to be subject to others, to serve them in the communion of the Church, and to 'obey and to submit' to the Church's leaders, holding them in respect and affection" (CCC 1269)

A worthwhile theme for prayer this week would be spend 5-10 minutes on each of these bullet points. How are you living the gift of your Baptism? How are you challenged by your Baptism? How are you responding to God through your Baptism? How are you developing the tremendous gift of Eternal son-ship & daughter-ship given and received freely through your Baptism each day?

Holy Family, rooted in the Life of Christ, Pray for us.

Eyes Ministry would like to thank the

parishioners and the many volunteers of Holy Family Parish for helping IHE serve the homeless and needy in our community during 2021. Special appreciation goes out

to our lunch and bridge team leaders and helpers, our food buyers, clothes sorters and soup providers, for all of their hard work and dedication.

Volunteers in the Saturday Lunch ministry prepared and delivered over 3,800 brown bag lunches to local individual and families in our area. The Bridge ministry volunteers prepared and served over 850 meals to needy men, women and children every Wednesday evening, working in association with Jesus Cares at Exit Zero.

Additionally, adult and children's clothing, shoes, jackets, coats, plus bath and bedding, household and kitchen, toiletries, toys, and other items that were donated throughout the year, were distributed to those in need through IHE and its relationship with multiple service agencies and churches in our area and beyond. This past Christmas season, Holy Family parishioners were very generous as four van loads of "gently used toys" were delivered to a local service organization in New Albany for distribution to children in need.

We especially thank two Holy Family students who conducted their own coat drives. Sixth grader Gus Bergmen collected coats from his neighborhood, and seventh grader Gracelyn Raelson collected through her annual birthday "Gifts for Gracelyn" coat drive. Together, over 100 coats and jackets were donated to In Heaven's Eyes. Special thanks to Holy Family teachers and administration, for instilling and encouraging a spirit of caring, compassion and community involvement in their students.

Happy New Year to everyone, and please continue to pray for, volunteer, and support In Heaven's Eyes Ministry.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed. "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder



of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as

well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.
