SPRING LETTER TO RESIDENTS

Shorewood Residents:

It has been my honor to serve as your Mayor for the past 20 years, and as a board member for 28 years.

I sincerely believe that I am leaving the position of Mayor with many major accomplishments for the Village of Shorewood. Starting out as Trustee in 1993 I had a vision that Shorewood needed a center of the Village where we could congregate, have events and be proud of as village residents. When I was asked by Mayor Hofer to run in her place in 2001 and was elected, I immediately formed a Town Center Committee and got to work making it a reality for Shorewood. 6 years later we were holding a ceremony to dedicate the new Village Hall and plaza area. One year later we were honoring veterans with our Memorial Fountain allowing all Shorewood residents to show love and respect for their relatives who served this great country of ours.

I have seen many major projects and worked on many problems since I have been in office, too numerous to mention here. Our newer residents might not be aware of the older items and our older residents may have forgotten, so let me just name a few. I was Trustee during the flood of 1996 and worked with Mayor Hofer as her Chairman of Planning and Zoning to open up the river front area through Shorewood to all our residents. We also worked together to help people get Federal, State and Village funds so they could move away from the danger into new homes. We worked together on the Jewel Store, our first full sized grocery store, and after she retired I followed by bringing Dominicks' (now Marianos'). A few years later Home Depot and Target with all the stores associated with those major projects. Many restaurants and service stores, our most famous one being Portillos' Restaurant. The redevelopment of our major intersections ie, River Rd and 52 along with River and Black. Multi-million dollar water and sewage projects and agreements have also been accomplished during this time period. Major housing developments such as Shorewood Glen which opened up Shorewood for seniors to have a beautiful, safe community.

As frustrating as it has been to move forward we have made huge strides to save Shorewoods' water supply by bringing an alternate source to replace our ever decreasing ground water. The most important step in that process was passing a referendum to make Shorewood a Home Rule Community. If this would not have happened and we were to begin to have supply problems the cost would fall completely onto the users, US! The capital cost and the supply cost would be on us! Believe me when I say, we would not like that at all.

I feel proud that I am leaving the Mayor's position in a sound fiscal position. I also feel proud that we are well balanced in our revenue and expenditure streams so we don't rely on a system that is not sustainable.

I am proud of all the things above, but there are things that I am most proud of. I answered all calls and emails that came in to me over the years. I went to peoples' homes if they needed help, or needed me to listen to them. If they called in the middle of the night I responded. If they came to me with a problem no matter how small it might have seemed, it was big to them, and deserved my attention. I treated people with respect and dignity when they came before the board, and if possible gave them the time they needed to get their point across. I have always approached the job as if I worked for you, not the other way around. No one is perfect, but I was proud to serve Shorewood, and hope to continue in some capacity.


Renovations set to begin at Cene's Four Seasons Park

On February 23, 2021 the Village Board approved the Cene's Four Seasons Park Pickleball / Tennis / Basketball Courts Refurbishment Project.

This project will include the addition of four pickle ball courts added to replace two tennis courts at the park. The other two tennis courts that are south in relation to the new pickle ball courts at Cene's Four Seasons park will remain and be refurbished to make them look like new! The scope of the project also will include resurfacing of our basketball courts.

In January we asked for your input and based on our survey results the new basketball courts will have a blue and grey color scheme!

This entire project is expected to start construction on April 1, 2021.



VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR NOTES

Sustainable Water Source Update

The Village currently provides residents and businesses with groundwater from six wells. Several years ago, scientists from the University of Illinois discovered the sandstone aquifer that our region relies upon for groundwater is declining and may not be a reliable by 2030. Since then, the Village has been preparing to switch from the sandstone aquifer to Lake Michigan water. Lake Michigan is one of largest fresh water sources in the world and currently provides water to most of the Chicagoland area.

There are several different ways to bring Lake Michigan water to Shorewood. When the Village hired an engineering firm to begin designing a water transmission line in 2018, there was only one viable water source option. This option involves running a large water transmission main through a ComEd easement to a connection point for Illinois American Water in Bolingbrook. For the past two years, the Village has been negotiating with ComEd to use their easement and also designing the transmission main and a water receiving station. Recently, three additional water source options were identified, including the DuPage Water Commission, City of Joliet, and a different connection to Illinois American Water. The Village is evaluating the long-term capital and operating costs for each of these four options with a tentative goal of completing a detailed analysis later this year.

Village Adopts Strategic Plan

Last month, the Village Board unanimously adopted the 2021-2023 Strategic Plan. The plan reflects the Village's priorities, commitment to measurable results and the delivery of quality services.

Work on the plan began in late 2019 with extensive community input, including a resident survey, focus groups with local businesses, and two Village Board workshops. The result of these activities was the creation of vision and mission statements and identification of organizational values:

Stewards of the Public Trust – We maintain the public's trust through reliable, transparent service.


Skilled & Competent Workforce – We are committed to maintaining a highly-trained, committed workforce.

Village Board Approves FY 2021-2022 Budget

Looking back on the past year, the COVID-19 pandemic has posed unprecedented challenges for our community, nation, and the world. The Village Board took several steps to protect and assist Shorewood residents, including the Utility Relief Program, waiving of late fees, and halting the disconnection of delinquent utility accounts. Shorewood businesses have been hit particularly hard by the pandemic. The Village Board created the Shorewood CARES Small Business Relief Program, waived 2021 business and liquor license renewal fees for most establishments, and allowed outdoor dining to name just a few.

While the past year has brought unanticipated costs and financial uncertainty, the Village remains financially sound. The operating budget (aka General Fund) is balanced and reduces total spending by more than \$1 million. In fact, nearly all other funds call for less spending in FY 2021-2022. The new budget has been shaped by several longstanding priorities, such as securing a sustainable water source and the construction of a public works facility. Sustainable infrastructure has been a Village priority for several years and is now one of four newly adopted strategic priorities outlined in the 2021-2023 Strategic Plan.

As of April 1, 2021, the Village will have no bonded debt due to the early pay off of the Village Hall bond. Retiring this debt early will save over \$115,000 over the next three years and favorably positions the Village for a new borrowing later this year to construct a unified, public works facility. This new facility will allow the Village to merge operations under one roof and make way for redevelopment of the current public works properties.

Two new patrol officers are included in the budget. One will be hired mid-year and another will be brought on during the last quarter of the fiscal year.

The most notable capital investments include:

- \$15.6 million for construction of a unified Public Works facility on Mound Road
- \$1.54 million for Seil Road/Bridge engineering & land acquisition
- \$1.27 million for street improvements
- \$815,000 for a new traffic signal at Black Road & Shorewood Drive
- \$483,000 for sanitary sewer maintenance
- \$413,000 for replacement equipment/vehicles
- \$286,500 for pickle ball, tennis, and basketball court improvements at Cene's Four Seasons Park

A MESSAGE FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT



As the Spring and Summer months approach and we now start to emerge from what we hope is the end of the pandemic, people will start to spend more time outdoors. As our residents return to the Village sidewalks, bike paths and parks, the Police Department asks drivers to be more cognizant of their surroundings, adhering to the posted speed limits and obey all traffic laws, particularly when traveling through neighborhoods or in the vicinity of one of the many Village parks.

Traffic volumes nationwide have been reduced significantly over the past year but traffic crashes have actually increased. As more cars return to the roads, travel times will increase as will some motorists frustration with traffic and potentially lead to risk-taking behavior. Give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination, and be alert and aware of your surroundings at all times.

As we all hope for the pandemic mitigations to recede, let's look forward to a great spring and summer and be safe and courteous as the world returns to normal.

PLANNING A REMODELING PROJECT?

If you are planning any type of remodeling project this Spring or Summer, more than likely, a building permit will be required. There have been some changes as to what type of projects requires permits. Homeowners are allowed to do most projects around the house. Visit the Village website or check with the Building Dept. to see if your project will require a permit. (link: <http://vil.shorewood.il.us/departments/Building-Services/buildingdepartment.aspx>) If you are planning to do exterior work, your project may also require approval from your Home Owners Association.

If you are using a contractor, make sure they apply for a building permit. Contractors need to be licensed, bonded, and insured with the Village in order to perform work in town. They will have to provide the Village with a proposal or contract, signed by the homeowner before a permit can be issued. Beware of contractors that ask the homeowner to pull the permit. By doing so, the homeowner assumes all liability if someone gets hurt, or if the job is done improperly.

Looking for contractors? Check with neighbors and friends. A recommendation from someone you know is probably the best way to find out if someone has done a nice job. Don't be afraid to ask for and check references. Also, check with the Better Business Bureau to see if there are any complaints filed against the contractor. The Building Dept. has a list of contractors that are registered with the Village, but cannot make any recommendations. 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THE IMPORTANCE OF WATERSENSE

What is WaterSense?

WaterSense is a voluntary partnership program sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and is both a label for water-efficient products as well as a resource for helping you save water. The WaterSense label makes it easy to find water-efficient products that meet the EPA's criteria for efficiency and performance. WaterSense-labeled products are certified to use at least 20 percent less water, save energy, and perform as well as or better than regular models.



In 2019, the Village of Shorewood adopted Section 890.610 to the Village Plumbing Code, stating that all new plumbing fixtures and irrigation controllers shall bear the WaterSense label (as designated by the U.S. environmental protection agency WaterSense program), when such labeled fixtures are available. (Ord. 19-1925, 1-22-2019, eff. 2-1-2019)

Why is it important?

Simply put, WaterSense helps Americans save water. Through the end of 2019, the use of WaterSense labeled products has helped Americans save a cumulative 4.4 trillion gallons of water 522.9 and billion kilowatt-hours of electricity. WaterSense labeled products indicate that products meet the EPA's specifications for water efficiency and performance. Using products certified with the WaterSense label will help:

- Provide measureable water savings results.
- Achieve water efficiency through several technology options.
- Help maintain well water pressure in the event of fires.
- Require less maintenance on well pumps.

Something as simple as installing ultra-low flush toilets which may cost under \$100 to over \$300 depending on the type purchased, use only about 1.28 gallons per flush. That could cut your family's total indoor water use by as much as 20%.

OUTDOOR WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

Water conservation is something everyone should practice. Except for the air we breathe, water is the single most important element in our lives. It's too precious to waste.

In an effort to conserve water for fire protection, health and environmental reasons, the Village of Shorewood asks for your cooperation in complying with the following regulations:

DAYS: Addresses ending in even numbers may water on even number calendar days. Addresses ending in odd numbers may water on odd number calendar days. This applies year round including weekend and holidays.

HOURS: 6:00 am to 10:00 am & 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm

HAND HELD HOSE WATERING: 6:00 am to 10:00 am & 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm

NEWLY SODDED AND SEEDED LAWNS: A permit to water your lawn for newly sodded or seeded yards can be obtained through Water Utility Billing located in the Finance Department. These permits are valid for two weeks and allow you to water outside of the odd/even permitted days. No permits will be issued between June 15 and September 15. Permits must be displayed in a window.

Carpet is considered a bulk item and must be cut and rolled into 4-foot lengths. Each roll must not weigh more than 50 lbs. All carpeting and padding must be secured with tape or string. Up to eight (8) rolls of carpeting and padding will be accepted each week.





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
