Dear Fellow Disciples,

This Labor Day weekend had me thinking of the great encyclical by one of my favorite Popes, *Rerum Novarum* of Pope Leo XIII (1891). In this groundbreaking encyclical, Pope Leo discusses the rights and duties of workers, employers, and the government. During this time the world was experiencing the industrial revolution and many political changes. Socialism was offering some ideas that seemed good, but really became harmful to those who thought it would be helpful. Pope Leo XIII saw that amid all these changes, the poor were remaining poor (or worst, becoming poorer) and the rich were only becoming richer. There was obviously a problem and our Holy Father brought about some wisdom for the ages.

Some highlights from this document, which I highly recommend everyone to read, are the following: the right to private property, the right to organize, the dignity of the human person, the centrality of the family, religious freedom, the rights of workers, and the role of the government in protecting these rights. There's a lot more in the document, but I can only focus on so much in one page. Here is my attempt to summarize the encyclical for you on this day where we celebrate the gift that is human labor.

To be able to work is a gift that promotes human dignity. The ability to work allows for one to feel part of society, contribute to the building up of society, the satisfaction of providing for ones needs and the needs of their family, and work allows us to exercise our free will. Almighty God has given each of us unique gifts that we are called to use to build the Kingdom of God (remember a parable about talents? Matthew 25: 14-30). By sharing our talents for both work and charity, we contribute to society and building up the Kingdom. Everyone wants to feel "needed" as part of our human nature. When we feel "needed" we in turn feel more "human." We all want to contribute to society in positive ways. Being able to work upholds our human dignity.

Because we're all called to protect and uphold human dignity for all people from conception to natural death, this means that the relationship between employers and employees must be one of mutual love and respect. *Rerum Novarum* promotes the right of people to own private property. This means the employer is allowed and encouraged to make a profit, but they also need to make sure their employees are taken care of and making a livable wage as well. Remember, Pope Leo XIII was trying to stop the trends of the poor getting poorer while the rich get

richer. Employers can make their large profits as long as their employees are taken care of. If the employees are not taken care of, then those employees have the right to organize themselves and bargain for a better arrangement with their employer. Obviously, the Holy Father makes it clear that peaceful means of organizing and bargaining are to be used. Employees shouldn't burn down the factory or shoot their boss. Only peace can bring about true unity.

Two of my favorite words were famously called on by Pope Leo XII: Subsidiarity and Solidarity. The principal of subsidiarity asks disciples of Jesus to solve problems at the most local level. When you have a problem at work, you don't run to the CEO. First, you go directly to the person causing the problem. If that doesn't work, you go to the manager or supervisor. If that doesn't work, you go to the director or department head. The last person you go to is the CEO. Subsidiarity promotes human dignity by not "passing over" people. Solidarity is our call to be with those who are suffering. This weekend, as we celebrate the gift of labor, remember those who live in countries where there is not enough labor to go around. Solidarity is best practiced by living close to that situation. Donate an entire paycheck, if you can, to a homeless shelter or food pantry to be in solidarity with those who do not have a regular paycheck. Fast for an entire day to be in solidarity with those who go hungry every day. Solidarity is a challenge to remind ourselves that not everyone is as blessed as we are.

Finally, Pope Leo XIII also discusses that while private property, the right to work, the common good, and providing for our families are good things, we are not made for this world. It's good to have a house, car, education, food to eat, etc.; however, our goal must always be heaven. As a priest once told me, "*There is only one luggage rack on a hearse.*" We can't take the house, cars, boats, vacation homes, etc. with us when we go. Even our un-spent communion money will stay behind. We're made for more than this world. It is best to spend our limited time on earth preparing for eternity in heaven.

For those who are blessed to have a job and labor, be grateful to God for this gift and your job. For those struggling to find labor, contact Catholic Charities and search the Archdiocese website, there's always a parish hiring somebody. If I or St. Edward can help in any way, please reach out.



NEW SCHOOL YEAR – NEW ROUTINES!

As a new school year begins, this is often a time of year to re-start, or begin, good habits! It may be a better sleep schedule, managing our time to be more productive, getting to the gym, etc. It's not just students who need the routine and good habits, we adults do too!

Here are some Spiritual Habits to re-start or begin with this new school year. We don't need to wait for Advent, Lent, or New Years. Begin today!

- Pray Daily! Start with five minutes of silent prayer and slowly work your way up to a Holy Hour.
- Read the Sacred Scriptures daily! Here are the books to start with: Gospel of Mark, Gospel of Luke, and Acts of the Apostles. Once you finish those three, come talk to Fr. Dom or Fr. Jim.

- Pray the Rosary daily! It takes 15 minutes. Pray it together with your family. Do this as part of your daily prayer time.
- Fast from meat (or another food/drink) on Fridays. This practice doesn't only have to be during Lent.
- Volunteer monthly to serve the poor. There are tons of places in Chicago that need help!
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation every 4-6 weeks. We hear confessions every Saturday at 12:00pm in Church.
- Walk or ride your bike to Church instead of driving - help the environment!
- Take advantage of our paper recycling bin! You can recycle paper and cardboard products right next to our school building.
- Join a ministry here at St. Ed's! Check the website for our various ministries.
- Invite someone to join you for Holy Mass here at St. Edward. Help us evangelize our community!

These are some simple suggestions of good habits to start or rekindle as a new school year begins. Try as many as you can! If you fail, no worries, just try again!
