Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This week we will celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. There is no more powerful intercessor than our Blessed Mother, who is Queen of heaven and earth. Our Lady is our nature's solitary boast because while being 100% human and 0% divine, she avoided sin her whole life. For God to become human, He needed a pure and chaste vessel to be born from and solid parents to raise Himself as human. Our Catholic theological tradition has four dogmas on our Blessed Mother that I figure today would be good to remind us of.

The Immaculate Conception (*celebrated December 8 - a Holy Day of Obligation*)

Mary was immaculately conceived in her mother's womb (St. Ann). This means that Mary was saved from original sin, not that her conception was a miracle. St's. Ann and Joachim conceived Mary the old fashion way; what we celebrate is that from the moment of her conception she chose God over everything else and was given a special grace to save her from original sin. This is what makes her conception Immaculate: she was freed from original sin. The importance of this dogma shows that God needed a pure human vessel to become human Himself.

Perpetual Virginity

For our Blessed Mother to remain pure, aside from never sinning, she also needed to be pure in her body. The dogma of Mary's perpetual virginity again reminds us that Mary remained pure all her days and that Jesus is 100% human and 100% divine. Jesus was miraculously conceived in Mary's womb through the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit. This dogma does not mean sex is a bad thing, nor does it mean that sex is inherently sinful. It does mean that Jesus has both human and divine origins.

Mother of God (*celebrated January 1 - a Holy Day of Obligation*)

In the early Church, and still among some protestants, it is argued that Jesus isn't human at all. This heresy comes up time and again, but it's not possible because for God to save us from our sins, He had to become human. Moreover, God needed to be 100% human, like us in all things but sin, so He could redeem all of humanity. This means God needed to have human parents, even if both

were not biological. This is the importance of celebrating Mary as Mother of God.

Assumed into Heaven (*celebrated August 15 - a Holy Day of Obligation*)

If the above three statements are true, then Mary would not suffer the effects of original sin: death, pain, and labor. While it is debated if Mary died or not, what the Church is certain about is that her body was assumed into heaven completely: body and soul. This is a sign of hope that when our bodies and souls reunite at the resurrection on the last day, we too will be assumed into heaven forever.

As you can hopefully see, these Marian Dogmas are more about Christ than they are about Mary, and Our Lady wouldn't have it any other way. Looking ahead to the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), I would highly recommend making the Holy Rosary part of your daily prayer life. It takes about 15 minutes to pray the Holy Rosary, which I think we can all agree is not much time at all. St. Louis de Montfort once said that in order to get to know Jesus better, we must go to the person who knew Jesus best: His mother. Praying the Holy Rosary helps us to know, fall in love with, and become more like our Blessed Mother and our Blessed Lord. Start today! Pray the Holy Rosary. Make it part of your preparation for our patronal feast day next Sunday!

Every First Friday we have Eucharistic Adoration from 9:00am-6:30pm, Benediction at 6:30pm, and a Healing Mass at 7:00pm.




Praying by Lighting Candles

It has been part of our Catholic tradition to light candles at the shrines of Saints for centuries. The lighting of a candle symbolizes for us the eternal light of Christ that casts out all darkness. In this Easter season we look to the Paschal Candle for this symbol as well.

To light a candle at a shrine, like our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph shrines, we're seeking the light of Christ through the intercession of that particular Saint to answer our prayer. Each candle stays lit for three days and we ask for a \$3.00 donation to pay for the candle.




