Dear Fellow Disciples,

While many may have taken down their Christmas decorations, today is the last day of the Christmas season. Today as the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord, we bring our Christmas celebrations to a close, but this was not always the case. Before our liturgical calendar changed in the 1970's, the Christmas season lasted until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (AKA: Candlemas), on February 2nd. Traditionally on the Presentation of the Lord we bless candles to be used in Church for the new year, hence the nickname Candlemas. I wish we still celebrated Christmas until February 2nd, but that's ok.

We've lost many cool and fascinating traditions since the Second Vatican Council, however we also picked up many new traditions that are beautiful, too. I will admit though, sometimes I sit back and scratch my head when I hear about what we lost after the council compared to what we gained. On the other hand, we're nowhere near completing everything outlined in the council documents. Many historians have said it takes at least 100 years for a Church council to really take root and begin seeing fruitful changes come about. The Second Vatican Council only ended 57 years ago, so we're just over the half-way mark.

The whole Church (laity, clergy, religious, etc.) continue to read, discern, study, and implement the documents and vision of the Second Vatican Council. All our Holy Fathers since St. Pope Paul VI have convened synods with both the laity and clergy to discuss how the Church should be implementing some aspect of the council. More recently, Pope Francis has called synods on the Family, Youth, and coming up soon a synod on the process of synods, which to me sounds like a meeting to plan a meeting. What becomes frustrating during these long processes and meetings is that we, the people of God, expect some great change to happen. All of us, myself included, have the expectation that once a document is signed or meeting convened by the Pope and/or bishops that something will come out of it right away and that is never the case.

Remember, the Holy Father is the Vicar of Christ and oversees the universal Church. That's no small task. Whenever the Holy Father calls people together, he's calling together the laity and clergy from around the world and they're discussing issues that affect every country. While we in the United States blame the

priest shortage on celibacy and that only men can be ordained, other countries, and even whole continents, have more priests than they know what to do with. Here in the United States, we're fortunate to have religious freedom (even though the government like to challenge that freedom), but other countries have no religious freedom. Bishops and priests need to live in hiding and offer the Sacraments in secret. There's a lot more to administrating the universal Church than we think.

I share all this because I know many of you are concerned with recent documents and promulgations by the Holy Father and even our own Cardinal, especially around the liturgy. Remember, the Church is much bigger than St. Edward, She's bigger than the Archdiocese of Chicago, and She's bigger than the United States. We may be frustrated by what the Vatican and Cardinal Cupich want to focus on and policies they create, but at the end of the day we're still in a very long process of figuring out the Second Vatican Council. Mistakes are going to be made, the evil one is going to confuse bishops and the laity, and not everyone is going to make the right decisions all the time; however, we must trust that the Holy Spirit is at work. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Jesus Christ is fully present in His body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. That's what matters. Don't focus or spend too much time worrying about what happens in Rome or downtown. Focus on what the Lord is doing in your life and here in our local Body of Christ at St. Edward. Trust that Christ meant it when He said the gates of hell will never prevail against the Church. We are the Church, Pope Francis is the Vicar of Christ, and we're called to live in joyful unity together. It's ok to disagree and to challenge, that's part of our discernment as a Church, but we're still called to live in joyful unity even amidst our disagreements and challenges. This is how faithful disciples of Jesus act. If you ever need a model, look to the Cross.

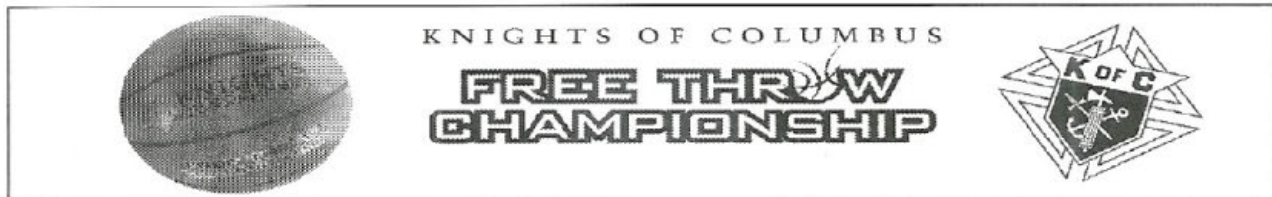

On June 26, 2020, Fr. Ricardo Antonio Cortez Martínez, rector of the St. Óscar Arnulfo Romero seminary in Usulután, El Salvador, sent a request to the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America for financial aid for 42 seminarians in the philosophy stage of their formation. Less than two months later, on August 7, Fr. Ricardo was found assassinated. Despite a falling homicide rate in El Salvador, three priests were slain from 2019 through August 2020.

To answer the call to priestly or consecrated life is a courageous act of faith, especially in a time and place where priests face violence, as Fr. Ricardo did. The Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America recognizes the courage and openness of seminarians, such as those at the St. Óscar Arnulfo Romero seminary, by supporting their formation as they prepare for lives of dedicated service. Your support for the Collection for the Church in Latin America makes it possible for young men in El Salvador and throughout Latin America and the Caribbean to answer that call. 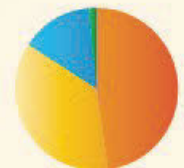
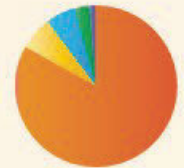

FEAST DAYS: Bus service will also be available for certain feast days and holy days of obligation. Call the rectory office at 773-545-6496 for times and information.

FEES: There is no cost to ride. Donations are always welcome to pay for gas.

GENERAL PROCEDURES:

- Our bus is equipped with an elevator lift and two wheelchair spaces. Please note our church building will not be accessible by wheelchair until the Fall of 2021.
- Anyone who would like a ride to Mass must call the rectory office at 773-545-6496 by 5:00 pm Thursday to reserve their seat for that weekend.
- Because of COVID restrictions, passengers are limited to a max of seven (7) and everyone must wear a mask on the bus at all times. When restrictions are lifted, the passenger capacity is fourteen (14). Spots will be assigned on a first-call, first-served basis each week.

TRANSPORTATION VOLUNTEERS: All our bus drivers have valid and up-to-date driver's licenses and are insured by the Archdiocese of Chicago. All our drivers are volunteers who are sacrificing personal and family time to participate in this ministry, please be understanding and patient with them. If there are any issues, please contact the rectory office.
