Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This coming Saturday, January 22, is the National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children (join us for Holy Mass that morning at 8:30am). It's a bittersweet day where Catholics across the country join together and pray for an end to the unjust act of abortion. It's bittersweet because it's a worthy cause for everyone to rally behind; but also devastating to be reminded how many innocent children are murdered because our country allows for abortions.

It is my hope, and I know many of you share this same hope with me, that very soon we will see the end of our federal government allowing for abortion. I'm not hopeful we will see the end of abortion in the State of Illinois but ending it on the federal level is a huge start. Hopefully people's hearts will open and hear the truth that life begins at conception and that the human in a woman's womb has the same rights as the woman carrying the child.

Many unfortunately still believe the lie that pro-life groups fail to offer resources after the child is born. At least we here at St. Edward know that's not true since we have a great connection with the Women's Center on Elston and Cicero; as well as other organizations our parishioners serve at like The Well of Mercy (a maternity home). When we proudly say that we're pro -life, we mean that we're PRO-LIFE. It's frustrating when others ignorantly assume "you stop caring for life at birth" and that couldn't be further from the truth. As Catholic disciples of Jesus, we're pro-life in every sense of the phrase: we care and pray for the protection of all human life from conception through natural death. I'm very proud that our own pro-life group here at St. Ed's organizes the monthly food drive for the poor, our Christmas Giving Tree, 40 Days for Life, and fundraisers for the Women's Center.

Another common argument from pro-abortion supporters is to allow exceptions in the law for victims of rape and any other sexually violent acts done to someone. To quote one of my favorite TV shows, *Law & Order*, the character Ben Stone famously said, "we can never lower the standard of justice to make it equitable, rather we must raise everyone to the same standard." We cannot take the rights away from the unborn because an injustice was forced upon their mother. I don't mean to diminish anyone's suffering, but no matter the injustice done to one person, that cannot be used as a reason to take away someone

else's rights. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion are all hot buzz words these days in government and the workplace. How can we set the standard for these three important goals if we're not willing to include the unborn? Anyone who promotes abortion is antidiversity, anti-equity, and anti-inclusion because they don't recognize the inherent human dignity of children who are alive in their mother's womb. For these same reasons we cannot allow for euthanasia and the death penalty. All human life is sacred regardless of a person's stage of life, the sins they've committed, and their health.

My sisters and brothers in Christ, we must be strong advocates for the safety and protection of all human life. Our unborn brothers and sisters are absolutely the priority since they are the most defenseless. Prisoners awaiting the death penalty have their own voice and defense lawyers; victims of euthanasia have their own voice, doctors, and lawyers; victims of sex trafficking, racism, sexism, and other violent crimes have their own voice and social justice groups; but the unborn have no voice of their own. We must be their voice.

While I am hopeful that federal abortion laws will soon be over, I'm not hopeful for our state. Never hesitate to reach out to our local government leaders, especially your State Representatives and Senators, and tell them they need to change the laws of our state to protect ALL HUMAN LIFE FROM CONCEPTION TO NATURAL DEATH! Removing justice from any person is not equity, we must raise up everyone to the same standard of justice so that we can truly have "liberty and justice for all."






