

BUILDING STUDENTS IN FAITH

Resurrection parishioner Emma Hoffman is on a mission to build students in faith at Grand Valley State University.

For the next several years, Emma will be working at the Michigan college as a Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) missionary. Her goal is to serve God and to help college students strengthen their faith just as the FOCUS missionaries at Indiana University helped her.

Statistics suggest that an estimated 80% of people who leave the Catholic faith do so by the age of 23. Having just graduated from IU, Emma witnessed this first hand. She said she noticed that college campuses are becoming indifferent, and in some cases even hostile, to Christianity. For those who enter college feeling lost or unsure of themselves, it can be easy to abandon their faith.

"I was one of those people who went to college and felt lost," Emma said. "I had the choice in front of me to walk away from the faith altogether if I wanted to. I knew that no one would question it, and I may have even been applauded for it. But praise be to God, He was right there with me all along because in that time in my life, I also began to feel a growing desire within myself to learn more about the faith and actually start living it out."

When Emma arrived at this crossroad in her faith journey, it was a FOCUS missionary who guided her toward God. Emma had been attending a FOCUS Bible study. When Emma felt a desire to grow her faith her junior year, her Bible study leader, Lauren, asked her to join FOCUS's faith formation.

"It was such a blessing because Lauren was the first person who really saw that desire within me and wanted to walk with me in it," Emma said. "Lauren started me on this path of rediscovering my faith because she saw what no one else did."

Emma became really involved with FOCUS her senior year. She began leading her own Bible study, started developing deeper relationships with the FOCUS missionaries at IU, and even began leading some girls in faith formation. As Emma learned more about her faith and about the FOCUS missionaries, she began to desire the life these missionaries had. She saw their devotion to the sacraments. She watched the missionaries attend daily Mass and pray a daily holy hour. She witnessed the joy they found in spending time with students and walking with them in their faith lives. She wanted to be a part of it.



WHAT JESUS DOESN'T SAY

"If Jesus wanted us to (fill in the blank), he would have said so." We hear this argument applied to every controversial topic under the sun. Whenever someone is trying to make a case for a decision they have already made, they call in Jesus' scriptural silence on the matter as their expert, unimpeachable witness. And sure, there's much Jesus doesn't talk about in the Gospels. But by this logic, we would have to assume that Jesus doesn't care, for instance, if we drive well over the speed limit (he doesn't discuss cars and highways in the Bible), when we know that is just not the case.

Like the scholar of the Jewish law who challenges Jesus to define who exactly his "neighbor" is, we can argue semantics all we want. But if we rest in prayer and look deep into our hearts, we know what path we need to take, and it's usually not the easy one.

I find that I do this plenty in subtle ways. I lament that a situation facing me is not sufficiently "black and white". I become frustrated, claiming I don't know what the right answer is, insisting I can't be blamed for the ramifications of my decision. What I need to be doing in these situations is asking God for His guidance, even if it makes me nervous. I need to be like the scholar. He was brave enough to ask, even though I think he knew he wouldn't like the answer. Let's strive for that courage.

EMMA HOFFMAN FOCUS MISSIONARY (Continued from Cover)

"However, I was very afraid and most likely would not have had the courage to actually apply to become a missionary had it not been for some very clearly answered prayers," Emma said.

During Emma's senior year at IU, she attended a FOCUS informational event where seniors and graduate students could ask questions about the life of a FOCUS missionary. Emma went to the event not even considering becoming a missionary. She left feeling differently.

"I walked out of that night with a desire on my heart for a life that the missionaries were describing, and to be frank, that desire terrified me," Emma said. "The next day, though, I couldn't stop hoping, 'Could I actually be a missionary?' But then my rationale would kick in and tell me, 'You don't have the experience. You really just started your faith journey. It would be too hard. You're too shy. No, you wouldn't be able to do it.' Despite these arguments, though, I kept going back to asking, 'But what if I did?' This back-and-forth argument went on in my head for the majority of the day until I made myself so confused that I finally sat down and began to turn those thoughts to Jesus."

So Emma grabbed her Bible and read the daily Gospel, which was Luke 5:1-11, the calling of the first disciples. The end of that passage reads: "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men. When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed Him."

"That was the answer to my prayer," Emma said. "I knew in that moment that Jesus wanted me to do this, that the desire I felt so strongly in my heart was placed there by Him. He was telling me that I didn't have to fear this because He was calling me to it. And even though I was scared of the unknown, I also felt a deep joy and peace in the decision to say 'yes' to becoming a FOCUS missionary."

Emma will move to Michigan at the end of the month. At Grand Valley State, she will be investing deeply in the Catholic community there. She will work to form relationships with the students, lead two or three Bible studies each week, and lead a group of girls in faith formation, all while striving to maintain and deepen her own faith. Emma also will work closely with her teammates and the Chaplain at the Catholic Center on Grand Valley's campus.

"I'm excited to begin living the life I've felt called to for a long time," Emma said. "I accepted this position as a missionary back in October 2021, so quite a bit of time has passed. But I've never doubted that I made the right choice. I know this is where the Lord wants me right now. I am just excited to see what He has in store."

Emma has one piece of advice for young people, and it is based off John 10:10, where Jesus states: "I came so that they may have life, and have it more abundantly."

Emma said, "Jesus wants to give us a life of fulfillment, desire, and joy! And I speak from personal experience when I say, the Lord knows where you are, He knows your heart, and He will work with whatever you give Him. He will make it known to you what He desires for your life. Remain close to Him through a consistent prayer life, the Sacraments, and finding a good community of people who encourage you in your faith instead of making you feel like you need to hide it! Do not be afraid of where He calls you, because no matter where that is, it will be so much more beautiful than anything we could ever plan for ourselves!"


