



# PRINCIPAL'S REFELCTION — WHO WILL OUR CHILDREN FOLLOW?



The Christmas story we share with our children is about following God's messengers and traveling towards Christ. Mary and Joseph both said, "Yes" to the angel's request and brought Jesus into the world. The shepherds followed the angels' proclamation and went to Bethlehem to meet Jesus. Last, the three kings followed a star to find our newborn king. Each of these people listened and followed God's messengers which led them to meet and worship Jesus.

Parents and teachers at St. John the Baptist School are called to be God's modern day messengers to our children. It's not an easy task, the world is far louder today than it was 2000 years ago when Jesus was born. Because of this, we must make sharing the message of Jesus a priority. At first glance, we can often find the image of the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph and the Christ Child intimidating — who are we to aspire to that level of discipleship? How could we ever hope to conform ourselves to that mold?
