DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

Reflection From Deacon Rich:

Signs of God's Love

How do we recognize Jesus, Mary, and Joseph?

Next to Easter this is the most sacred time of the year for us. We have Christmas, the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Savior. Today we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. But I think they also were just like any other family. No, I don't mean they weren't a special family. We all know how special they are. But as a family Mary and Joseph loved their little Son Jesus and wanted to watch Him grow up. I can imagine Mary rocking her baby infant in her arms, giving Jesus all the love, a mother gives a little baby child. Then as Jesus was a little toddler watching Him run and laugh and play with the other children. Always enjoying watching the growth of the King of Kings on earth.

Then came the day when Mary and Joseph panicked and couldn't find Jesus. They looked all over. Where could He be? This precious King that was given to them to raise for God is lost. Really, I think when Jesus answered them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" He probably figured that would have been the first place that they should have looked.

But I wonder when was it that Mary and Joseph realized that Jesus was different. Of course, they must have remembered the prophecy that was given them by the angel Gabriel, but I wonder how much of that had actually sunk in. Obviously, they couldn't have known all that was in store for Jesus and for their family. One thing for sure, Mary and Joseph probably understood that Jesus was different from all the other 12-year-old boys who traveled with them when they saw Jesus in the temple with the questions, answers, and understanding in the midst of all the teachers. Did they remember back to the message of the angel before Jesus' birth? What was their conversation like as they traveled back home together?

Picture our lives. How many of our families have turned out different than we imagined? How many of the dreams we had become reality for our children or for us when we got older? How has our son or daughter grown up differently than we expected when we rocked them as babies in a cradle? Maybe we are surprised to see our children grow up to be something we never imagined. Maybe on the other side, we are a son or daughter who has grown up outside of our parents' dreams. I can imagine there is a loss then on our part. Maybe we struggle with accepting our own difference and just want our parents to do the same. Perhaps with tension and pain and hurt along the way.

But today's feast gives us hope. God's ways are not our ways, and God has a plan. God creates us all uniquely and our differences are what make us holy. We humans live into God's plan. Always pray for our differences to be working with God's will. The Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen said, "When our will is one with God's will, then nothing can happen to us except what God wills; Thus, we will never be disappointed."

Remember to use the simple small Holy Family prayer in all we do, in all problems and temptations. <u>Jesus, Mary, and Joseph</u>. St. Pope John Paul II said, "It is in the Holy Family, the original 'Church in miniature' that every Christian family must be reflected."


