

WANT YOUR CHILD BAPTIZED?

The Sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. Whether we are baptized as infants or adults, Baptism is the Church's way of celebrating and enacting the embrace of God — the welcoming into Christ's Church. Here are some things to keep in mind when preparing for baptism.

- Your child's baptismal name should be preferably a saint's name. If the child's first name is not a saint name, be sure that the middle name is a saint name.
- There are many secular names that are not acceptable for baptism those that are foreign to Christian sentiment such as seasons of the year, days of the week, and obviously those that conflict with the Christian faith.
- The child's Godparents must consist of at least one baptized and confirmed Catholic; the other may be a baptized Christian.
- The child's Godparents must be one man and one woman.

As we begin a new semester of Faith Formation, please keep all of our students in your prayers. Here's a list of prayer intentions directly for our children.

- 2) **Pray that your children honor God.** He deserves praise and glory especially at Mass. Pray that they have grateful hearts and a desire to attend Mass.
- 3) **Pray that they are generous.** Sometimes it's difficult for children to think outside themselves. Pray that we can be good examples of generosity so in turn your children can learn to be generous at home and at school.
- 4) **Pray for protection for your children.** A good prayer for this is the Guardian Angel prayer. Call on their guardian angel to protect them from physical and spiritual harm.
- 5) **Pray that they know how much they are loved by God.** By them knowing this, which starts by knowing the love of their parents, love can transcend in their lives, giving way to a full and abundant life!

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

Reflection From Deacon Rich:

With You I Am Well Pleased

Did you ever think that at our baptism God says to each of us, "you are my beloved sons and daughters, with you I am well pleased?" I think God does, because He is pleased with all His children being baptized. Now God claims us for Himself in baptism. Just think, we become a member of the Catholic Church, the Church that Jesus started. We are forgiven all sins. We are forgiven original sin and all personal sins, as well as all punishment for sin. What a freeing state of being to be in. What a fresh start to have with a life. So, any adults that receive baptism into the church start off with Jesus saying those precious words to them just like the little children.

Baptism is the gateway into the Sacramental life. We all want a good life for our children. We want them to have a complete happiness in life. It starts with Baptism for them because now they are baptized to eternal life, true life. In this life there are no guarantees. However, God guarantees a good life, a beautiful life with Him in heaven. He wishes us well and desires nothing but good for us. Jesus said, "I am the God of the living." We are never alone. With Baptism we have life in God. Baptism offers us the life to the fullness of God.

We now end the Christmas season with the baptism of Jesus. But we need to keep the Christmas child's birth burning in our hearts knowing that He led the way to a new life with God. As we start the Ordinary Time, we need to reflect carefully on the Jesus who will always be the one leading us from His birth, to the cross with the way to live our lives. It is Jesus who is our guide through life to help us understand and show the way to live after our baptism and through all the other sacraments. Yes, Jesus is our guide, our mentor, through the hard times we have to face in life.

During life we face troubles, heartaches, disappointments, failures, and the sins of our life due to <u>concupiscence</u>, the weakness of our nature, the tendency to sin. Life isn't easy for us. But what can we do in our life to help us through all this? Well, how fortunate we are with the sacrament of Baptism that gives us the building block of graces and virtue to help us.

We are now able to prepare ourselves to receive the other sacraments of Reconciliation, (Confession) to free ourselves again of sins committed. Then receive the Eucharist, the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus. Receiving Jesus in our hearts to tell Him how much we love Him and build up more grace and strength to combat our troubles and heartaches in life and give them all to God. When we do this on a regular basis, we keep gaining the graces from God to build our holiness and strength to keep getting closer to Him. Then we have Confirmation that is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "by the sacrament of Confirmation, (the baptized) are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit."

WOW! There's a lot that happens for us with the sacrament of Baptism. The other Sacraments we might receive are Matrimony, Holy Orders and then Anointing of the Sick. Who knows now where God will lead us? One thing for sure, if we are praying just like Jesus did after His baptism, at our end we will be fortunate enough to hear God say to us, "With You I Am Well Pleased."
