## WANT YOUR CHILD BAPTIZED?

The Sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. Whether we are baptized as infants or adults, Baptism is the Church's way of celebrating and enacting the embrace of God — the welcoming into Christ's Church. Here are some things to keep in mind when preparing for baptism.

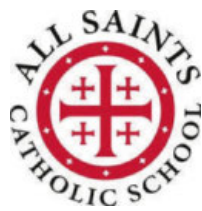
- Your child's baptismal name should be preferably a saint's name. If the child's first name is not a saint name, be sure that the middle name is a saint name.
- There are many secular names that are not acceptable for baptism — those that are foreign to Christian sentiment such as seasons of the year, days of the week, and obviously those that conflict with the Christian faith.
- The child's Godparents must consist of at least one baptized and confirmed Catholic; the other may be a baptized Christian.
- The child's Godparents must be one man and one woman.

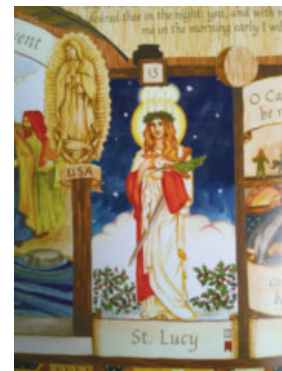

# DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

## Reflection From Deacon Rich:

### “Do Whatever He Tells You”

Three years ago, I did a homily on today’s readings. I’d like to share that homily in this reflection today.

Cana is just a few miles west of Nazareth, the first miracle recorded in John’s Gospel. In Ancient Palestine the bride and groom didn’t go away for a honeymoon. They stayed home the entire week with an open house wearing their wedding clothes and a wedding crown. The wedding feast was the finest of all the celebrations.

Now, the wedding feast is at risk. Running out of wine can be a catastrophe at a wedding. A father saved wine for the celebration from his own little vineyard each day from the time his daughter was born. This would have been a huge embarrassment and shame that they couldn’t provide the best for this occasion. Mary asks Jesus to use His gifts to share with the community at this feast. Jesus not only saved the day; He saved their dignity. Apparently, Jesus needed some coaxing from His mother to use His gifts. Today, we have many gifts from Jesus.

Venerable Fulton J. Sheen was once asked why he goes to Holy Hour, Adoration, one hour every day for over 50 years of his life. He said, “because it is the greatest gift Jesus left for us to keep celebrating.” But they asked why every day one hour? What inspired you, a saint, a pope, a theologian? He said no.

Bishop Sheen said that it was actually a little Chinese girl who was 12 years of age. When the Communists took over China, they seized many of the Churches. There was this one particular Church where they put the priest under house arrest. They went to the Church, forced open the tabernacle, and took out the ciborium and threw the hosts on the floor, desecrating the Blessed Sacrament. In the back of the Church there was this little Chinese girl who saw what they were doing. The soldiers either didn’t see her or didn’t care. This made such an impression on this little girl. So, for 32 nights the little girl would sneak quietly into the Church and go to the Blessed Sacrament spread on the floor and pray 1 hour of Adoration. The priest said he knew he had 32 hosts in the tabernacle. At the end of each hour, she would lick up 1 host. Back then lay people didn’t touch the host. On the 32<sup>nd</sup> night she came and prayed for 1 hour and licked up the last host. As she was sneaking out, the Church door accidentally slammed shut. The little girl got scared and ran. The guard awoke and chased after her, caught her and beat her to death with his rifle. She was a martyr for the sake of the Eucharist.

So, Bishop Sheen said, “if that little girl had so much love for the Eucharist to risk her life 32 times to reverence Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, I could spend 1 hour of every day of my life before the Blessed Sacrament, to adore the gift of gifts from Jesus.”

Paul’s letter to the Corinthians encourages the sharing of gifts. Paul’s letter coupled with our Gospel reading reminds us that we need to be like Jesus and be willing to share ourselves, share our gifts with the community, with the parish. The Holy Spirit distributes gifts to all of us, whether time, talent, or treasure.

It’s a New Year and time to roll up our sleeves and claim and share the gifts we have and encourage others to share their gifts as well. This is how the endless celebration of God’s love will continue. So, pray and “Do Whatever He Tells You.”

## MEMORY VERSES

## QUESTIONS ON SCRIPTURE

### First Reading:

The prophet Isaiah used marriage imagery (bridge and groom) to describe the Lord’s love for his people, Israel. What do you see as some implications of this marriage imagery?

### Second Reading:

Paul taught the Corinthians that the individual gifts of the Holy Spirit are meant to benefit and unify the community of faith. How do you use your spiritual gifts within your faith community?

### Gospel:

Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana was one of the first public “signs” he performed revealing his divinity. It also showed Jesus’ compassion, sparing the family shame at running short of wine. How do you imagine the family reacted to Jesus’ intervention and rescue?
