### WANT YOUR CHILD BAPTIZED?

The Sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. Whether we are baptized as infants or adults, Baptism is the Church's way of celebrating and enacting the embrace of God — the welcoming into Christ's Church. Here are some things to keep in mind when preparing for baptism.

- Your child's baptismal name should be preferably a saint's name. If the child's first name is not a saint name, be sure that the middle name is a saint name.
- There are many secular names that are not acceptable for baptism those
  that are foreign to Christian sentiment such as seasons of the year, days of
  the week, and obviously those that conflict with the Christian faith.
- The child's Godparents must consist of at least one baptized and confirmed Catholic; the other may be a baptized Christian.
- The child's Godparents must be one man and one woman.

### DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

### **Reflection From Deacon Rich:**

### Waiting-Believing

Waiting can be excruciating. During our lives we wait for so many things to happen either to us or for us. We wait anxiously as children for our birthdays. We wait for school to end and summer to start. We wait in anticipation for the news from the doctor on our test results. I remember the long wait I had for 5 years of study believing the end was so far away. Then came the day the last 6 months left of waiting for the day. Then came the day of my ordination. The wait

Well, in the Gospel reading today, we hear the fulfillment of something the Jewish people had anticipated for centuries. Just picture yourself in this Gospel as you read it again very slowly. Picture how Jesus goes to His hometown synagogue, where we can assume just about everyone knows Him. Jesus slowly walks up to read. He is handed the scroll with the exact prophecy of His coming, and then He reads it out loud to all of His friends and neighbors. Now, I'm sure that those who were seated in the synagogue must have heard these words hundreds of times before. But Jesus didn't stop there, did He? He continues on and says, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in our hearing." This was the climax, the moment of interpretation of the word of God.

Now the ears of the people probably really perked up. There must have been disbelief, surprise, wonder, anxiousness, anger, frustration, and even joy with all kind of feelings flowing through the waiting crowd. They were wondering if they should be believing their hometown boy who made good, that was already established in Galilee, could this be real what He is saying? If you were sitting in the synagogue when your neighbor Jesus stood up and read this passage from Isaiah, how do you think you would react? I mean they thought they all knew Him, but Jesus is the Messiah, speaking out the summary of His mission that is

about to begin.

Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ, said, "God can get tiny if we're not careful." Remember the people in the room with Jesus were waiting their entire lives dreaming of how they thought the Messiah should look and act. When Jesus was there right in front of them, they chose not to see Him for who He was. They had their own Messiah in their minds. They would give into their own doubts and their fears of believing. Now the words of the prophet maybe didn't sound as appealing to them.

What about our waiting for Jesus? What about our believing? Do we believe just because the Gospel said it, or do we believe because our heart really believes it? You see these are the things we always need to reflect on when we read the Gospels. We read them and don't just say, yah, OK, but truly reread and pray on what we have just read. Put ourselves into the story to see how we would react. Pray, and as always, I recommend Adoration to bring ourselves closer to Jesus with Lectio Divina. It is so powerful.

Sometimes we are like those in the synagogue, because it is easy for us to anticipate having our own desires fulfilled. We want waiting always to yield to us the results that we hope, don't we? But you know what, the challenge for each of us is to let God surprise us with a new vision we just didn't quite figure on. Waiting takes patience and faith, but believing is giving in to God's will not ours.
