

WANT YOUR CHILD BAPTIZED?

The Sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. Whether we are baptized as infants or adults, Baptism is the Church's way of celebrating and enacting the embrace of God — the welcoming into Christ's Church. Here are some things to keep in mind when preparing for baptism.

- Your child's baptismal name should be preferably a saint's name. If the child's first name is not a saint name, be sure that the middle name is a saint name.
- There are many secular names that are not acceptable for baptism those that are foreign to Christian sentiment such as seasons of the year, days of the week, and obviously those that conflict with the Christian faith.
- The child's Godparents must consist of at least one baptized and confirmed Catholic; the other may be a baptized Christian.
- The child's Godparents must be one man and one woman. If you'd like more information on the Sacrament of Baptism for your child, contact the parish office at parishoffice@saint-anne.org.

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

Reflection From Deacon Rich:

Jesus is Love!

The readings this weekend is really very rich. They are full of power, life, and lots of love. First of all, I would like to start this reflection off with a challenge for all of us. Today we get a nice listing of the different things that love is not. "It is not jealous, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quicktempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing." My challenge to all of us is to take this list before we go to sleep at night, and think over our day. How have we disappointed ourselves, others, and yes God? This would make for a pretty good reflection. Maybe even if it were done for the week. These would be great to use in Adoration in front of the Blessed Sacrament. What a conversation we would have with Jesus with just one of these. I know I would.

The second reading has the depth of love. It explains how important love is in our life, ending with, "So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love." This is used at so many weddings, yet, I wonder if it is for the wisdom of the reading or just because it sounds poetic for the service. When I graduated from high school one of my classmates wrote in everyone's yearbook the following, "When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things." The he signed it. I asked him why, and he said he felt everyone will need a reminder now that they were leaving high school it's time for maturity.

It's always easy to apply "Love is patient, Love is kind," because it's slow-ly becoming the "Live! Laugh! Love" of life now. It's easy to love people we genuinely like being around. But it's much more difficult to love them in trying times or with challenging people. Servant of God Dorothy Day said, "I only really love God as much as the person I love the least." This is where Jesus wants us to be in our life of love with Him. The person could be our neighbor that has a negative remark toward us. Maybe it's that little one in our house that may have colored on the walls with permanent marker, or misplaced the keys again and again making us late for work. It could be in a parking area someone complaining about the way we parked our car. Maybe it's our heated discussion with religion or politics lately. Even worse of all maybe it could be that person in the mirror that is staring back at us that we just cannot seem to love. But God asks us to love all, regardless. And guess what, He uses the same guidelines of patience and kindness to everyone, even ourselves.

You know we easily downplay words in life that we use or hear because they are hard to follow. We do that with people we know and love. In the Gospel for today Jesus at first was starting to sound amazing. If you remember last week's Gospel ended with the same line that this one starts off with, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Amazed at the words that came out of His mouth until they figured, hey, this is Joseph's son, who in the world is He to tell us anything. Where was the love of friend, neighbor, even relative possibly? They didn't realize who they really had among them. Jesus who is love. We know now. But wait, let's put ourselves in the story back then, would we agree with the crowd? Reflect on this for a while.
