

## From the Pastor's Desk...



The term "Fake News" is one that has come into our daily vocabulary in the past few years. It refers to news that is not actual news (in many cases falsehoods) that are simply voiced to sway public opinion in one way or another. It represents a deception, not real news. When we look at the treatment that the prophet Jeremiah received, some six hundred years before the life of Christ, we must realize that "Fake News" is not really a new thing. It has existed throughout history.

The princes or oligarchs dislike Jeremiah's proclamation of God's word, because they prefer their mythology or narcissism to the call to living in the truth. The princes go so far as to say that Jeremiah is not really interested in the welfare of

the people "but in their ruin." King Zedekiah himself surrenders his power to the governing elites and hands the prophet over to them. The price Jeremiah pays is imprisonment and eventually confinement to a muddy cistern.

It is an outsider, Ebed-melech, an Ethiopian, who becomes the instrument of salvation for the prophet to Israel when he speaks out to the king sitting at the Gate of Benjamin. The word of truth will not be silenced, even when the powers would have it otherwise.

The Christian tradition has long connected Jeremiah as a foreshadowing of Jesus. Consider, for instance, the way that King Zedekiah hands over Jeremiah to the ruling powers in a way that might remind us of Pilate's washing himself of responsibility of Christ's death. Like Jeremiah, Jesus will not back down in his proclamation of God's truth, despite the inevitable destiny or, as he himself puts it, the "baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!"

Our Lord's prophetic utterance at the beginning of today's Gospel forcefully engages us in the fire that is stirring in Christ's bones, just waiting to be unleashed. "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" he announces. The distress that Christ speaks about concerns the fate of God's word, which must come to the earth and bring in its wake not peace, but division.

Christ holds the key to unity as well. It is the cross of Christ that becomes the way to embrace the conflict embedded in division. Encouragement comes from resisting powerful lies that inflate personal and cultural ego. Encouragement comes from "keeping our eyes on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith." And, yes, we have someone even greater than Jeremiah here!


