

Being Angry with God

When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all filled with fury. They rose up and drove [Jesus] out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill... to hurl him down headlong... but he passed through the midst of them and went away.

Lk. 4:28-30



Is it OK to be angry with God? Even to yell at him?

In the Gospel reading for this weekend (Lk. 4:21-30), we hear the story of Jesus' rejection at his hometown in Nazareth. Jesus has just proclaimed that he is the Messiah and has come to fulfill all the promises of God. He will bring joy, freedom, vision, and justice.

The people of his hometown hear this message. They want this fulfillment now. They want those promises to be fulfilled in the way they want them fulfilled. Jesus' neighbors and friends have very clear expectations of what the Kingdom of God should look like, and they want Jesus to make that happen immediately. But Jesus doesn't work that way. He points out that the Kingdom doesn't always come when and how we want it. It is *God's Kingdom, after all. We cannot understand or control it.*

So the people respond with rage. Instead of patiently waiting in faith for God's plan to bear fruit, they attack Jesus and attempt to kill him.

But Jesus is able to take their rage. It does him no harm. He simply walks away to continue his work in fulfilling God's plan of salvation for them.

Our anger can't harm God. His love does not flinch when we yell at him. He simply keeps loving us and working for our good. So, if you are mad at God, let him know. He will stay faithful to you.

The very people who try to kill Jesus are the ones he saves on the cross. Our anger doesn't make God stop loving us. Like a screaming child, God holds us in his arms until we can calm down.

STM AFGHAN GOOD NEIGHBOR TEAM FORMING

A Good Neighbor Team is a small group of people from a local church that partners with World Relief -Fox Valley to welcome and walk alongside a newly arrived refugee or refugee family. Good Neighbor Teams work with World Relief staff to prepare a house or apartment, gather basic household items and furnishings, and pray for the refugees' adjustment. Members of the Good Neighbor Team commit to visiting their refugee family at least once a week. These visits often provide opportunities to help practice English, orient to American culture, and meet other practical needs, but the primary goal is to offer genuine and mutual friendship. We are looking for 5-15 people interested in forming a Good Neighbor Team at St. Thomas More with a six-month commitment. Weekly time commitments for each team member will vary throughout the Team experience and depend upon the number of team members and the needs of the refugee family.
