From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Ordinary Time is no ordinary time. Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

So, while we go about our day the call of discipleship is ever present. We are to model Jesus in the ordinary events and circumstance of our ordinary lives. In this we change what is ordinary into something extraordinary. Our lives become icons of Jesus' life. This means that the mundane and routine things we do as well as the standout moments hold within themselves the capacity to show Jesus to the world. In the

light of Christ's presence, something as ordinary as cooking a meal, changing a diaper, paying bills, or driving to work hold within themselves the power of salvation. All the things we do can then become salvific. Think of that next time you're stuck in traffic.


Spirituality Tap In

The Signs and Symbols of the Mass

"There isn't one thing that we do at the Mass that didn't grow organically through the Old Testament into the time of Christ. The Mass itself grew out of God's own intention, from Adam to the Christ. **If you get the Mass right, you get the world right.**" – Msgr Deutsch, Walkthrough the Mass Talk.

The Procession: evokes our earthly journey towards heaven.

The Confession/Confiteor Prayer: takes away our venial sins and prepares us to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

The Liturgy of the Word: "The liturgy of the word is an integral part of sacramental celebration...." used to nourish the faith of believers through the inspired word of God – CCC #1154. If we went to mass everyday, we'd read the entire Bible every 3 years!

The Homily: Just as Jesus gave "homilies" to his followers, our priests give homilies to us. This is the priest's opportunity to "speak of God to humans".

The Creed: a reminder to the early Christians of their identity in Christ. Today, just as then, the creed reminds us of our identity in Crist and our call to more in our daily lives.


The Offertory: our opportunity to put our prayers and desires at the foot of the cross. You, your worries and prayers, are symbolized by the physical "bread and wine" being presented to Jesus on the alter.

The Intentions: our opportunity to "speak of humans to God". Through this, the church community prays for the needs of those we serve.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist: The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life."– CCC #1324


