From Fr. Jack

Dear Parishioners,

One of the most influential philosophers of the 20th century was Josef Pieper, a devoted Catholic mind to the resurgence of St. Thomas Aquinas' thought and writings. Among Pieper's more notable works is *Leisure: The Basis of Culture*, published in 1952, in which he states, "Leisure is an attitude of mind and a condition of the soul that fosters a capacity to receive the reality of the world." He believed that all culture is founded on leisure and thus, if lost, so is culture. Here are some quotes that get to what leisure is:

"We are not-at-leisure in order to be-at-leisure." – Aristotle

"Come to me all you who are weary and I will give you rest." - Jesus

"Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O Lord." - Augustine

With the advent of mass media, I believe one of the major lost art forms of proper leisure is reading. Reading for leisure is not an escape, nor is it meant to distract us from the world. Rather, it ought to bring us further into reality, truth and life.

Try Alpha




