

Of course, the biggest thanks of all goes to the indefatigable Theresa Brandt and Neal Thompson, who once again spearheaded the sale, as they have for so many years now — they did much of the organizing and picking up of donations. I was able to drop in during the sale a little bit, and I heard many times how much people look forward to it every year, both in the parish and around the neighborhood. And, who knows, perhaps we were able to help a few people get something genuinely useful for a fraction of its usual price.

The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul is this week. For several years of his pontificate, Pope Benedict XVI gave a series of weekday audiences about the saints. Here is what he said about Peter, the fisherman: “He was shocked by the Lord’s announcement of the Passion and protested, prompting a lively reaction from Jesus. Peter wanted as Messiah a ‘divine man’ who would fulfil the expectations of the people by imposing his power upon them all; we would also like the Lord to impose his power and transform the world instantly. Jesus presented himself as a ‘human God,’ the Servant of God, who turned the crowds’ expectations upside-down by taking a path of humility and suffering . . . And it seems to me these conversions of St. Peter are a great consolation and a great lesson for us. We too have a desire for God, we too want to be generous, but we too expect God to be strong in the world and transform the world on the spot, according to our ideas . . .

“God chooses a different way. God chooses the way of transformation of hearts in suffering and in humility. And we, like Peter, must convert, over and over again. We must follow Jesus and not go before him: it is he who shows us the way.”

### Tips to Stop Swimmer's Ear Before it Starts

As summer is heating up, everyone tries to get in as much water time as possible. Well don't let swimmer's ear ruin the water fun whether it is a pool, lake or the ocean. Ears are tricky parts of our bodies. Blockage and pain can turn vacation fun time into problem times. The key is to be vigilant and follow this rule: "When you are not in the water, keep the water out of the ears."

Bacteria and fungal infections in the ear canal can result from spending extended time in the water. Water collects in the ear canal, often trapped by wax, and the canal stays damp leading to a perfect environment for bacteria to grow. The ears may itch, turn red, feel full and start having pain. Your doctor can prescribe medicated drops to combat problems. DO NOT take over the counter antihistamines or decongestants as studies show they do not work for the ear.

If at all possible, prevent swimmer's ear from happening. Try these 3 simple tips from "500 Time-Tested Home Remedies and the Science behind Them" for keeping your ears dry.

- Use anti-swimmers ear drops. – Mildly acidic solutions create an environment that rejects bacteria and fungi. Shake 1 tsp. of white vinegar with 1 tsp. rubbing alcohol in a dropper bottle. Squeeze 2-3 drops into ear before swimming. Tip head to side to let the solution reach the ear canal, then tip back to let it drain out. Repeat on other side.
- Keep ears dry: after swimming, immediately dry the outer ears thoroughly. Tip head to sides to be sure all water is drained out. If necessary, use a hair dryer on LOW heat held about 1 foot away from the ears.
- Ease the pain until seen by doctor: Make an ear warmer by pouring 1 cup of uncooked rice into clean sock and tie a knot at the top. Microwave the sock on high for 30 seconds. Check that it is warm, not hot. Lie down and apply to painful ear.

Just a reminder if you or a family member go into the hospital and would like a visit from Father Nickolai, **you or someone in your family** must contact the parish. Under HIPAA guidelines, the hospitals will not contact the parish you are in. Thank you!




### Gloria
