

This week includes the feast of the Apostles Simon and Jude. Simon is called "the Zealot" in St. Luke's account; he may have formally belonged to the movement known as the Zealots, or this may have been simply a nickname. The only recorded words of Jude, also called Thaddeus, are in the 14th chapter of St. John: "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us and not to the world?"

In a Wednesday audience, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI remarked: "This is a very timely question which we also address to the Lord: why did not the Risen One reveal himself to his enemies in his full glory in order to show that it is God who is victorious? Why did he only manifest himself to his disciples? Jesus' answer is mysterious and profound: 'If a man loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him.'

"This means that the Risen One must be seen, must be perceived also by the heart, in a way so that God may take up his abode within us. The Lord does not appear as a thing. He desires to enter our lives, and therefore his manifestation is a manifestation that implies and presupposes an open heart. Only in this way do we see the Risen One."



The St. Rose Philippine Duchesne Social Justice Council asks: "Did You Know...?"

The St. Rose Philippine Duchesne Social Justice Council had an informative discussion on Critical Race Theory at our October 12 Zoom meeting. This is what we learned and discussed: According to Kimberlé Crenshaw, a law professor, Critical Race Theory is often vaguely, but falsely, raised as an ominous, threatening ideology being taught to schoolchildren that teaches hatred of white people or the nation

Critical Race Theory "just says, let's pay attention to what has happened in this country, and how what has happened in this country is continuing to create differential outcomes. ... Critical Race Theory ... is more patriotic than those who are opposed to it because ... we believe in the promises of equality. And we know we can't get there if we can't confront and talk honestly about inequality." Critical Race Theory is a discipline that seeks to understand how racism has shaped U.S. laws and

how those laws have continued to impact the lives of non-white people.

Academic experts, including Kimberlé Crenshaw say Critical Race Theory is not what is being taught in K-12 education curriculums.

Critical Race Theory is a study in academia based on the concepts of systemic and institutional racism. Systemic racism refers to how the government has discriminated against Black, Indigenous and other people of color through unjust policies concerning housing, employment, criminal justice, education and more.

Extra Weight!

With many of us carrying "Covid" pounds and the holidays fast approaching I felt it appropriate to run this article.

Did you know that for every extra pound of body fat you carry, your heart needs to pump blood through an extra mile's worth of blood vessels; an immense burden on your heart? For instance, if you are 10 pounds overweight, there are 10 extra miles of blood vessels you are carrying around. Obesity also increases your likelihood of developing atherosclerosis (fatty deposits on the inner walls of blood vessels), diabetes, and high blood pressure, all of which put you at a greater risk for heart attacks and strokes. Obesity also makes it more difficult to remain active. The more sedentary your lifestyle is, the greater your risk for heart disease. Fortunately, by reducing your weight to normal levels, you can also reduce your risk of developing these disorders. Incorporate a healthy, balanced eating plan with a regular exercise program (heart-strengthening aerobic exercise if possible). According to the American Heart Association, the healthiest diet is one that limits sodium to no more than 3,000 mg per day, cholesterol to no more than 300 mg per day and fats to no more than 30% of your caloric intake per day. For exercise and heart health it is important to exercise vigorously for 20-30 minutes 3-5 times per week. Start now to avoid more weight later.

Kindergarten and 1st graders learned the Story of Creation and are practicing prayers.

3rd grade is learning how the Catholic Church welcomes us through the Sacraments and guides us to love our neighbors.


4th graders are busy learning about the Trinity. In 5th grade the students are discussing the Liturgical calendar and learning sign language to accompany song and prayer.

October is the Month of the Rosary. As a community of parents, students and catechists we joined in a decade of the rosary.


