In *Jesus of Nazareth*, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI begins his discussion of the Magi by mentioning the pagan prophet Balaam, who appears in the Book of Numbers, serving as soothsayer to the king of Moab. Interestingly, Balaam is an historical figure whose existence is confirmed by extrabiblical evidence. 20thcentury archaeologists have found an inscription on the East Bank of the Jordan, naming Balaam, son of Beor, as seer for several deities, and author of various oracles.

"I see him, but not now," Balaam's prophecy says, "I behold him, but not nigh: a star shall come forth out of Jacob and a sceptre shall rise out of Israel."

Benedict remarks that, through Balaam, recognized as a prophet in the pagan world, this prophecy would have circulated beyond Israel, getting the attention of at least some in the non-Jewish world, fostering expectation of a king from among the Jews a king associated somehow with a star. The work of first-century Roman historians Tacitus and Suetonius confirms that speculation was widespread concerning the emergence of a world ruler from Judah at that time.

The point is, a star alone would not have inspired such a journey, unless those who traveled were people of inner unrest, on the lookout for the true light of salvation. "The men of whom Matthew speaks," Benedict concludes, "were not just astronomers. They were 'wise.' They represent the inner dynamic of religion towards self-transcendence, which involves a search for truth, a search for the true God, and hence 'philosophy' in the original sense of the word. Wisdom, then, serves to purify the message of 'science:' the rationality of that message does not remain at the level of intellectual knowledge, but seeks understanding in its fullness . . . They represent the journeying of humanity toward Christ. They initiate a procession that continues throughout history."

If you are interested in signing up for a class or have questions please call Peggy Baker at 314-837-3410, or just show up for the first class.




