

From Our Pastor

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today we come together as one for the Feast of the Holy Family. What is it that makes a family holy? First, I believe we are carved out as family as part of God's plan.

Second, over five years ago, Pope Francis, addressing families at a Mass, said: "I would like to ask you, Do you pray together from time to time as a family? Some of you do, I know. But so many people say to me: But how can we? ...But in the family how is this done? After all, prayer seems to be something personal, and besides there is never a good time, a moment of peace... Yes, all that is true enough, but it is also a matter of humility, of realizing that we need God... all of us! We need his help, his strength, his blessing, his mercy, his forgiveness. And we need simplicity to pray as a family: simplicity is necessary! Praying the Our Father together, around the table, is not something extraordinary: it's easy. And praying the Rosary together, as a family, is very beautiful and a source of great strength! And also praying for one another! The husband for his wife, the wife for her husband, both together for their children, the children for their grandparents....praying for each other. This is what it means to pray in the family and it is what makes the family strong: prayer."

As part of this feast, I would ask you to think about the specialness of your family. How do you stand out in our world today? What are the good things that you embrace? To me, we need to reflect and celebrate the goodness that is part of our family life. And lastly, I believe that the year 2020 has taught us that, more than ever, we need to resolve to spend time together, to communicate, to plan special family meals, to have fun together. It can truly make the difference. It might take some getting used to, but it is so worth the time and effort.

Do you have any New Year's resolutions for the upcoming year? Maybe it is the typical of watching our food, or exercise. Perhaps this is a time in which our commitment to family might also be strengthened. Or can we resolve to pray more, find more quiet, read something worthwhile?

My prayer for this New Year is for peace in our world – especially in those countries, neighborhoods and homes where too many experience violence. Could we make a pledge to pray daily for peace?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.
