#### From Our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we return to Ordinary Time. We continue to listen to the stories of Jesus' ministry. In Todays' Gospel, we hear of the first "sign" from John the Evangelist. That is a good way for us to look at the work and ministry of Jesus – as signs of who he is – more Epiphany narratives. They tell us of Jesus and his connection to God

The first reading connects to the Gospel for it uses marital imagery to tell of the relationship between God and Israel. This tradition was begun with the prophet, Hosea.

Today's excerpt comes from a section of Third Isaiah that consists of songs celebrating the return from exile. The subject of the present song is the restored city of Jerusalem. God is now rejoicing over the city as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride.

Does love between human beings help you understand how much God loves people? Can you relate to this in your prayer and reflection?

The Gospel story then tells us of a wedding. Jesus and his friends are there, as well as Jesus' Mother, Mary. If scriptural references to marriage are to tell us about our relationship with God, what does this particular story say to us? I think of the word, "Abondanza!" That is translated to "Abundance." Does this help our image of the heavenly banquet? Does this tell us something about God's love for us?

In commenting on this story, Pope Francis said:

Like Mary at Cana, let us make an effort to be more attentive in our squares and towns, to notice those whose lives have been "watered down," who have lost—or have been robbed of—reasons for celebrating; those whose hearts are saddened. And let us not be afraid to raise our voices and say: "they have no wine."

The cry of the people of God, the cry of the poor, is a kind of prayer; it opens our hearts and teaches us to be attentive. Let us be attentive, then, to all situations of injustice and to new forms of exploitation that risk making so many of our brothers and sisters miss the joy of the party. Let us be attentive to the lack of steady employment, which destroys lives and homes. ... Let us be attentive to the lack of shelter, land and employment experienced by so many families. And, like Mary, let us say: they have no wine, Lord.


