We call an eye-opening revelation or manifestation an epiphany. The Epiphany of the Lord marks God's love appearing in a glorious way to the world. We celebrate God's revelation of Christ's birth in Bethlehem and witnessed by Magi from the East. This year, we celebrate Epiphany on January 5, the Twelfth Day of Christmas. The famous Christmas carol counts the Christmas days up to the Eve of Epiphany. Before the bishops moved Epiphany to a Sunday in the Christmas season, Epiphany was celebrated on January 6.

The Magi may have arrived at Bethlehem months after Jesus' birth. Matthew writes that they came to a house, not a stable. Their number and names are not mentioned in the Gospel, but they brought gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Though the Magi traveled form the East, artists often depicted them in a way that represented the diversity of humanity, symbolizing that the Good News of Christ's birth is intended for all races and nations

An Epiphany tradition marks the front door inside lintel with blessed chalk. We ask God to bless all who enter our homes this new year with cheer and health. From at least the seventh century, the letters stand for the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar (or Gaspar), Melchior, and Balthasar. They also represent "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ bless this house."

Crosses symbolize Christ meeting the Magi. The month of January is named after the two-faced Roman god Janus, doorkeeper of myth, and patron of beginnings and endings. Epiphany brings a Christian dimension to January-Christ is the true Alpha and Omega. The inscription made with chalk from the earth recalls the human nature of the Son of God. We offer at today's Masses blessed chalk and envelopes. You may use the ritual printed to the right to mark your main door or doors.

L: May the Lord watch over all who pass through this door. May he bless this home and all it shelters. In the name of the Father, + and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


Parish Life
