Dear Parish Family,

There is an old joke that says if you want to make God laugh; just tell him your plans.

This year has definitely not gone according to plan. While I do not know that God is laughing, I do think our parish has given Him reasons to smile.

This pandemic has taught all of us, I think, a great lesson about what is important in life. Perhaps it was important for us to go without the Eucharist so we could value it more fully. Maybe the loneliness we felt at home was important so that we can better appreciate how it feels to see a warm smile from a friendly face across the aisle at Mass.

This year has also caused us to take a hard look at how we operate as a parish, and the ways in which we make ends meet in order to fulfill our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

With that in mind, I want to take a moment and share the numbers on where we are at as a parish. This is not just my parish, and it does not belong to our parish staff... it is *your parish* and it is important that you know how things are going.

Offertory Giving

Last fiscal year end, June 30, 2020, we had received \$547,159 in support. This year-end, June 30, 2021, we are at \$535,980 which represents a decrease of \$11,179 in support.

Fiscal Year-end Giving

Fiscal Year-end giving has always played an important role in our annual budget. Many families sent in contributions after my letter asking for help when the year-end gap was \$32,805, narrowing the gap to \$11,179. Thank you to all who donated what they could to narrow our shortage. Blessings to all.

Changes we have made since Covid

Given all that has happened this year, our parish took a number of important steps.

Those include:

Encouraging use of our online giving platform: WE SHARE or mailing in donations.

Recording Masses and emailing bulletins.

Monthly Newsletter mailed to all to include those not using email.

Updating our Parish website.

Sending information through my Parish APP.

Offering online workshops and Discovering Christ Series.

Continuing to be good stewards of parish offerings by paying off debt and keeping the building and grounds in good shape as needed.

PPP loan (Payroll Protection Program)

Our parish was one of thousands of organizations who took advantage of a federal loan program to help keep people on the payroll during the early days of the crisis. We were granted a loan, and we used it as intended – to keep our employees working and paid instead of laying them off when we had to close our doors. By doing so, we helped reduce the unemployment costs that would have been carried by the government. The funds helped keep our staff employed during the first few months of the pandemic, but that was a short-term, stop-gap measure. The Payroll Protection Program loan was forgiven; however, we cannot continue to rely on the government to support or fund the important work of making disciples and calling people to Jesus Christ.

Tithing vs. Stewardship

Question:

What is the difference between tithing and stewardship?

Answer:

Both tithing and stewardship are part of a spiritual way of life that calls us to use all of our resources for the service of the Gospel. Everything we are and everything we have comes from God. Offering back to God what He has given us is part of how we worship and give thanks to God.

Tithing is the practice of giving back 10 percent of what we earn. It comes from the Old English word for "ten." The first Scriptural example of tithing came from Abraham who gave a tenth of his possessions to the priest Melchizedek. He did so as an act of thanksgiving to God.

Stewardship as a way of life calls us to use well all that we have and all that we are, placing all things in service of others and God. Stewardship helps us see the good we can accomplish by making God and our spiritual life the most important values in our life. Whatever we accumulate in this life stays here. We can't take it with us! Both tithing and stewardship help us remember that nothing is mine or even ours ... all belongs to God. ©LPI

Church Collections

Question:

Where does the money go that is collected each week at Church?

Answer:

This is a good question! Every parish has financial obligations, including the basic operation of the buildings, salaries, maintenance, and improvements. In addition, there are schools to support, programs to run, charities to be funded, and operational expenses like hosts and wine for Mass, music books, vestments, and so on. In some cases, cemeteries and other buildings need attention. Finally, there is the diocesan assessment that each parish pays to help run the diocese and the support services provided to each parish.

Most parishes manage to get by with the collection, a few fundraisers and endowments. But contrary to popular opinion, cash flow is also a problem, and many parishes operate in the red. The Finance Committee is responsible for assisting the pastor in fiscal management, and good stewardship is the basis for successful programs. ©LPI

Wealth

Question:

If one's gift or talent is making money, and one uses that money for honorable purposes, is it considered a spiritual gift? What does our faith teach us about wealth and stewardship?

Answer:

Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God, and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. In an article entitled "The Many Faces of Stewardship," Catherine Doherty wrote about stewardship in the "nitty-gritty everydayness of my life," and about the currency or "money" of spiritual stewardship: love, understanding, and unselfishness.

For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my part. But if I give because I want to help and, in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. Regardless of our money-making talents, in the end, true stewardship comes down to how well we practice the virtues of faith, hope, and love within our life and with those in our community and church. Ultimately, the most important element in stewardship is not intangible—it's you! ©LPI

Give us wisdom to know how and when this good earth needs our special attention.


Helps us not to be shortsighted and assume that the earth can heal itself without our help.

This we do in Jesus' name who is our brother and savior.




DISCOVERING CHRIST: COME FOR THE EXPERIENCE


