FROM THE PASTOR



The Genesis story of creation reveals that "God looked at everything He had made, and found it very good." This week Isaiah captures our relationship with God as, "We are the clay and you the potter -- we are all the work of your hands." Advent is a time to reflect on how God

sees His creation today, and to ask ourselves, how can our lives help make our world something He continues to find "very good"?

In October Pope Francis gave a remarkable homily titled Laudate Deum, in which he detailed how the environmental and human issues chronicled in his 2015 encyclical Laudato Si have intensified in the past eight years. He emphasizes again that human lives are inextricably bound to the environment, as its protectors, as its potential victims, and as the causes of it endangerment. The Holy Father warns that unless people of faith are motivated to secure the beauty of God's creation for all people, the survival of our world is in peril.

The Holy Father tells us, "We must move beyond the mentality of appearing to be concerned but not having the courage needed to produce substantial change." We must summon that courage and act.

The Advent scripture readings are filled with stories of courage -- Mary agreeing to be the handmaid of the Lord...John the Baptist risking his life to prepare the way for Jesus...the prophet Nathan bringing God's command to King David to build the temple -- each of these acted courageously because they understood their calling.

Keeping our world as the place God can continue to find "very good" is our calling today. Each of us praying, working together and letting our voices be heard can create meaningful change. We don't have to be superheroes to make a difference on matters involving the quality and safety of our environment, but we do need to think about what we as individuals and collectively as a parish can do to keep God's great and beautiful work as he created it, and not as years of human behavior have endangered it – behavior motivated by selfinterest, self-comfort, self-profit, and sheer selfishness. Join me in thinking and praying about these questions throughout Advent because in 2024 our parish will launch a new ministry that will lead us in serious conversations, brainstorming, and actions that I hope will involve all parishioners to help us take steps toward healing and protecting God's very good work. Together our small but meaningful steps can move us toward substantial change. Additionally, our parish's stewardship report for the year has been published. Please check out pages five through eight to see our parish's giving efforts this year. I sincerely thank you all for your generosity toward our parish and its outreach programs.

Bambinelli Sunday

In 1969, Pope Paul VI instituted the celebration of Bambinelli Sunday to help children and young people prepare for Jesus. Bambinelli is the name of the small statues of the infant Jesus in Rome. Since then, children have brought the figurine of the Christ Child from their Nativity sets to St. Peter's Square on the Third Sunday of Advent to be blessed by the Holy Father after his Angelus address.

Parishes around the world now join in the celebration, encouraging children to make the connection between the Nativity figures at home and the church where they worship every weekend. This year we had to adapt our Christmas rituals to the calendar, so the Bambinelli blessing will take place on

calendar, so the Bambinelli blessing will take place on the **second Sunday of Advent (December 9-10**), we encourage all households, young and old to bring the baby Jesus from their Nativity sets at home to any Mass at either Church to have them blessed. We hope that everyone will participate in this powerful witness to the celebration of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Opłatki Tradition's Christmas Blessings

Opłatki stems from the word opłatek, a thin wafer that is distributed on Christmas Eve. Opłatki is a tradition that originated in the Middle Ages, when bread was hard to come by, and the sharing of the opłatek was considered a caring exchange. The tradition continues to this day: in Poland and in many other Eastern European countries, Opłatki takes place just before the Christmas meal. An individual breaks off a piece of the wafer and passes it to another person with a blessing of what they desire for them in the upcoming year-good health, happiness, etc. The ritual is complete once everyone at the table receives part of the wafer and a blessing. Opłatki is a tradition to express unconditional love to your loved ones. The Opłatki Christmas wafers remind us of the Eucharistic meal that we share as one family in Christ and that we receive Christ's love through the Eucharist. Oplatki for your Christmas celebrations will be blessed and distributed at Masses on the weekend of December 16-17.

Migrant Ministry – Living Our Faith

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine you did it for me." Matthew 25: 46

The growing number of migrants in our community who have come seeking safety and, in some instances, survival, has inspired the creation of the St. Catherine, St. Lucy and St. Giles Migrant Ministry. Because migrants served by this ministry are homeless – mostly living in the Oak Park Police Station – the St. Catherine St. Lucy Parish rectory has become a place where they can shower on Tuesdays and Thursdays 8 to 11:30 a.m.

Right now the ministry needs volunteers for a variety of tasks including:

- Monday and Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. for receiving and counting donations
- Tuesday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. (shower days) for assisting in:
 - Welcoming and crowd control,
 - Shower set-up and breakfast set-up,
 - Staffing the clothes, coats and shoes rooms,
 - Clean-up.

With enough volunteers, the ministry would like to expand the shower days to Saturday as well as the current days. At this time no food or clothing items are needed but monetary donations are most appreciated to purchase other needed items and to enable purchase of a water tank that the program desperately needs.

Funding Our Mission

The past year has continued to be transformative for our parish. We have come together united in our goal to be a welcoming, vibrant and joyful community. Our parish is thriving in many ways and we are grateful as we continue our journey of spiritual and community renewal.

While our financial numbers show that we did not end the year in the black, overall, we ended the year in a positive position. We are grateful to all of you who supported our church and school. As you will see on the next page, we had a net parish loss of \$144,958. However, we must consider these unique factors in evaluating our overall situation:

- Christmas and Easter Collections fell short of our budgeted goal.
- Other expenses and extraordinary expenses were higher due to additional work needed to be completed at both worship sites including the water leak under the church.
- Mass attendance is improving but is still down from pre-pandemic levels.
- We will continue to make adjustments on expenditures where we are able.

Your **gift** is an important part of how we are able to serve and carry out our mission. Continuing and increasing your offertory will help to balance our budget. We ask for your prayerful continued support and, if your means allow, we ask that you increase your Sunday offering.

If you have not been contributing on a regular basis, or perhaps not at all, we ask you to pray and consider how important your faith and your parish is to your life. We hope you will join your fellow parishioners who already support the parish on a regular basis. We need **everyone** to respond, and if we do, we will be able to continue to offer and expand our vital mission.
