

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What must I do to inherit eternal life? So says a scholar to Jesus. The answer as the scholar saw it was to love our Lord our God with all our heart, with all our being, with all our strength and with all our mind, and our neighbor as our self. Jesus affirmed he was correct. Then Jesus goes on to explain who is our neighbor through a parable, the Samaritan man who passed by the man that was beaten. The Samaritan cares for the man then pays the inn keeper to continue the care, paying him for what may be needed. So who is our neighbor? The Samaritan man didn't know the man that was beaten! He didn't owe him anvthing! He just stumbled upon him!

This weekend I am grateful for the assistance of Fr. Isaac, our Missionary priest from India. (As you are reading this, I am in Kentucky visiting the replica of Noah's Ark, then will be at Niagara Falls the remainder of the week.) Fr. Isaac will undoubtedly answer the question "Who is my neighbor". If not, here you go, every human being that eats, breathes, and sleeps. Our neighbor is the human race! I often wonder what life would be like if I was born into a family that wasn't Catholic. Would I have faith of any kind? Would I be a good person? Would I even resemble who I am today? Our neighbors who were born into poverty, or born into an unsafe environment, or born into an unloving home, had no choice in the matter. But their faith allows them to get by. One of the comments I hear from people who have been to Casa Hogar in Peru is that in dire poverty, these children who are at the orphanage are the happiest kids they have ever seen. Why do you think that is? Well, because they are surrounded by the love of Christ. Giving hearts that allow them to eat beans and rice, have clean drinking water and powdered milk for nutrition, an actual bed to sleep in, and people who care.

That my brothers and sisters is what we are called to, to aid our neighbors and to love and assist them beyond reproach.


