

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

How many of you pay attention to the opening Collect (ca-lect) said as the opening prayer? I have to admit I didn't pay much attention to it prior to having to recite it as a priest. This prayer is meant to set the tone for the Mass we will be celebrate. This weekends begins: "O God, by whom we are redeemed and receive adoption, look graciously upon your beloved sons and daughters, that those who believe in Christ may receive true freedom and an every lasting inheritance..." Each of our baptisms gives us certain "privileges" from the very start of our lives. Original sin is wiped from us and the Holy Spirit is bestowed upon us. The seed has been planted. Our parents and god-parents are entrusted to develop the faith and guide the child in that faith. When this happens, our children begin learning the habits of our faith. I say habits because they also pick up other habits from mentors. These being we only go to Church on major holidays or when it fits into hectic schedules. They learn prayer as parents pray with them as they tuck them in bed, or they are never introduced to prayer except at Mass or in Church. For some this is never. So how do these words really mean anything as we hear them? Are they meant to just go in one ear and out the other? As with any part of the Mass, they are meant for us to reflect on how we are bringing about Christ in our lives. Is He active or passive in our daily lives? Do we see Him giving us "true freedom" and "an everlasting inheritance"? My friends, Christ wants to lead us, to walk the journey of life with us, and to nourish us with himself. Our kids need that same thing. But unless we live it out daily in our lives, many of them won't experience that unconditional love. We are the face of Christ to those around us, but more importantly to our families. When we see the gifts and grace God bestows on us through our baptisms, we experience something non-believers will never be touched by: a relationship that endures all test of time and heartache. A God who wants to be a part of our lives here on earth and into eternity.




