

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As our Inspired by the Spirit Campaign begins, I wanted to thank all who have so generously given to the campaign. So far we have raised \$188,660 from 14 families.

I was talking to my mother over the weekend and she was telling me she is going to the reception for the campaign at her parish in Rapids. As she was talking to a family member, their reply to her was "why are you even giving anything, let the rich people do that." Sadly, I don't think they are alone in that thinking.

Not everything in the Church is about money, we are tasked as a family of Christians to give of our time and talent as well as monetarily. Sometimes I know it is not possible to give financially, but we can give in other ways. Prayer, volunteering, etc.

Getting back to the comment made to my mother, I was greatly disappointed and spent the next 15 minutes talking to my Mom about why it's important to make the sacrifice for the campaign. This is for the future of the Church, not just the diocese of La Crosse but for us, right here at Christ the King. This campaign IS NOT just another way to milk us for money. It is to set us up financially for the troubled years ahead when our congregation starts to diminish. We are all well aware that kids are not staving in the Church as they go out on their own. A Pew Research found that the number of Catholics will be cut in half over the next 10 years. This means that things you have come to benefit from may have to be adjusted. Candles, parish paid positions, priests, Missions, youth education may have to be cut. My friends, it is critical that each person make it a point to give to this campaign. Not only will it take care of concerns we have now. but it will also sustain us into the future. A parishioner shared with me a homily they heard while out of town. It was about people helping:

**Somebody** got angry about that because it was **Everybody's** job. **Everybody** thought that **anybody** would do it, but **nobody** realized that **everybody** wouldn't do it. It ended up that **everybody** blamed **somebody** when **nobody** did what **anybody** could have done!


